Elmer Alfred Hoth, the son of Charles Hoth and Sophia Klemme Hoth, was born November 12, 1900 at Postville. He was baptized in St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Postville on December 26, 1900 and confirmed in Zion Reformed Church, Waukon in April 1916. He died at the Community Memorial Hospital on October 19, at the age of 61 years, 11 months and seven days, following a brief illness.

Following his marriage he worked in the lumber business in Postville and in other Iowa communities for 25 years. He then operated a hardware store in Postville in partnership with his brother, Clarence for 15 years. In the last few years he has worked with his son, Charles, in the Hoth Motor Co.

He was a state representative for this area in the Iowa legislature for four years. He served as a member of the St. Paul's Church Council during the time that the church was being built, and was a member of the Postville School Board, was active in the Kiwanis and Commercial Clubs in the community, and was a member of the Postville Volunteer Fire Department for a number of years.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

He is survived by his wife; two sons, Charles and John of Postville; one brother, Clarence of Postville; two sisters, Hazel, Mrs. William Behrens of Racine, Wisconsin and Florence of Postville; a grandson, Frederick Hoth; and a host of other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were conducted in St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Postville on October 22, at 2:00, with the pastor, the Rev. Charles E. Witt, officiating. Burial was in the Postville cemetery.

Rites Held For Carl J. Dreyer

Carl Johannes Dreyer was born near Hamburg, Germany on May 30, 1874, the son of Marie Bockendorf and Curt Dreyer. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Church at Nein Staten.

At the age of 16 he came to America where he made his home for a time with a sister in Chicago, Illinois. Wishing to be a farmer, he came to Iowa where he worked as a farm hand on the Albert Ziemann farm in Clayton County. Later he came to Frankville, where he was employed on the William Brandt farm. On December 1, 1903 he was united in marriage to Miss Magdalene Brandt, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Brandt. He became a member of the Frankville Community Presbyterian Church. A home was established on the former John Hardy farm west of Frankville, which he purchased, and to this union three daughters were born.

He retired from active farming in 1932 when he sold his farm to his daughter and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Lester Kamin, with whom he continued to make his home, pursuing his favorite hobbies of gardening and flowers. He also had been a keeper of bees for many years.

He had been in failing health for the past several years and on October 2, 1962, he entered the Waukon Veterans' Memorial Hospital where he passed away on Thursday, October 18, 1962, at the age of 88 years and five months.

He was preceded in death by his wife in July, 1924, his parents and one sister, Johanna, in Germany.
