BAGHDAD, Iraq — The American administrator in Iraq vowed to hunt down those responsible for a car bomb attack that shook central Baghdad, killing at least six bystanders and wounding dozens of others.

The attack outside the Baghdad Hotel on Sunday was the seventh fatal vehicle bombing in Iraq since early August. The bombings have killed more than 140 people.

"We will work with the Iraqi police to find those responsible and bring them to justice," Iraq's U.S. civilian administrator, L. Bremer, said after Sunday's bombing. So far, none of the planners of the previous bombings has been found.

Two cars exploded nearly simultaneously on Sunday, but military spokesman Lt. George Krivo said Col. Monday it was unclear whether the second car was part of the attack or if its fuel tank had been ignited by the first blast.
