**Carl Vannatta Datwyler, Winterset**  
 A funeral service was held Friday, Aug. 13, at Collins Funeral Home for Carl Vannatta Datwyler of Winterset, who died at his home on Aug. 11. He was 75 years old.

Born in Buckley, Illinois on Dec. 31, 1906, he was the son of John and Leona Vannatta Datwyler.

A self-employed carpenter, he spent most of his lifetime in Madison county.

He was married twice. On Feb. 4, 1928 he married Carrie Fulton, who died in 1963. He married his second wife, Louise Briggie, on Oct. 10, 1964. She passed away in November of last year.

Preceding Mr. Datwyler in death were his parents; a brother, Glen; and a daughter, Delores Miller.

Survivors include three daughters, Maxine Miller of Peru, Carolyn Dillinger of Victor, and Phyllis Ricketts of Randole, Washington; a brother, Wilson Datwyler of Peru; four sisters, Edna Woverton and Laura Clague of Winterset, Irene Spencer of Peru, and Velma Struve of Irwin, Ia.; 13 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

**Raymond Breakenridge, Louisiana**

Raymond Dean Breakenridge, a former Madison county resident who served two terms in the Iowa House of Representatives, died recently in Louisiana at the age of 84.

Born in Madison county on Aug. 17, 1897, he was the youngest son of James and Helen Perkins Breakenridge. He attended local schools and graduated from Winterset High School in 1917.

On Sept. 14, 1918, he married Vera Bowen of Chariton, who survives him.

He was a farmer by occupation, and was involved in many community affairs, including the Farm Bureau, school board, fair board, Farmer's Cooperative Association and the Methodist church.

Mr. and Mrs. Breakenridge retired in 1971 and moved to Natchitoches, Louisiana.

Preceding him in death were his parents, two brothers and a sister. Survivors include his wife, a daughter, Fern Christensen, and two grandchildren.

Born March 6, 1892 in Kent, Iowa, she was the daughter of Peter and Dielia Beeler.

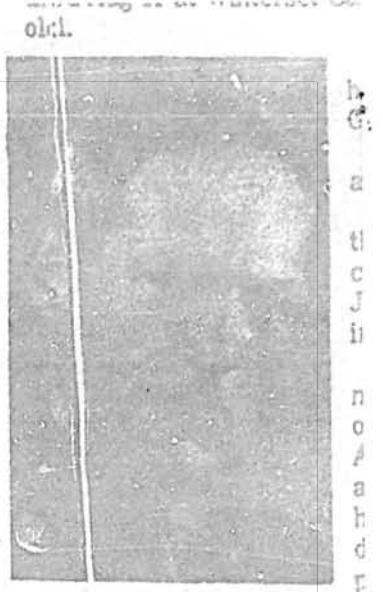
On June 9, 1910 she married C. A. McMurray in Beaver City, Nebraska, who survives her.
