# Dr. J. C. Kaiser funeral at Rockwell church Friday

Dr. J. C. Kaiser, 69, retired veterinarian of Rockwell, died suddenly Tuesday evening in a Mason City hospital. He had lived in the Rockwell area 28 years and practiced from 1935 until 1960 when he retired.

Dr. Kaiser was born June 25, 1893, at Earlville, son of John and Mary (Garrett) Kaiser. He was married to Myrl Richey, June 17, 1922, in Mason City.

He was an active member of First Methodist Church of Rockwell, vice president of the Men's Brotherhood of the First Methodist Church, a member of the Cerro Gordo County Conservation Board and president of the Community State Bank of Rockwell.

Dr. Kaiser was a veteran of World War I and a member of American Legion Gallagher Post 208 of Rockwell and 40 & 8 Voiture 66. He was a past local commander of the post and a past county commander of the American Legion.

He was president of the Rockwell public school board 18 years and helped build and organize the Rockwell-Swaledale Public School System.

Dr. Kaiser was a member of the Cyclone Club of Iowa State University. He was a member of Pearl Lodge 426, A.F. & A.M. Sheffield; Scottish Rite Bodies, Orient, Des Moines; El Kahir Shrine, Cedar Rapids, and the North Iowa Shrine Club.

He was state representative from Cerro Gordo County in 1957-58.

Surviving are his wife, parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Kaiser, Manchester; two brothers, Edward and Frank Kaiser, both of Earlville. He also has a niece, Kay Rodruck, Mason City, and an uncle, Carl Garrett, Earlville. He was preceded in death by a sister, Mrs. Carl (Anna) Rodruck.

The funeral will be at 2 p.m. Friday at the First Methodist Church in Rockwell. Officiating pastors will be the Rev. Vern Sorenson and the Rev. Herman Crawford.

Military rites will be conducted by American Legion Gallagher Post 208 of Rockwell at the Rockwell Cemetery. Visitation will be from 2 p.m. Thursday until noon Friday at the Patterson-James-Murphy Chapel in Rockwell and from 1 p.m. Friday at the First Methodist Church in Rockwell.
