Moved to Clinton w parents c. 1889/1900. Became barber at age 15. Became freight brakeman
on C & NW Ry on 17 Dec. 1906; conductor in 1913; terminal yardmaster at Belle Plaine 1919 and
at Clinton 1923. Retired from Railroad 1952.

Served on council, as mayor, and a number of terms in legislator. Lost in four-way
primary battle for 1948 legislature. In 1953 was chair of railroads committee. Suffered heart
attack in hotel room at DM on early morning 12 Jan 1955, while attending legislature. House
and Senate adjourned for funeral on 16 Jan., 8 reps and 3 senators attending funeral.

He was part-time lobbyist for state policemen's assn when not in legislature. Life member
American Railway Supervisors and Iowa Assn of Chiefs of Police; honorary member of Ia State
Sheriffs Assn and Ia Assn of Firefighters; Mason, Shriner, Elk, Moose, Eagles; Farm Bureau;
Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen; Vet of C&NW Assn.

Survived by 2d wife, son, 2 grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren; 6 sisters, 2 brothers;
predeceased by parents, 1st wife, 2 sisters and 5 brothers.

1st wife, b. Germany, came to US as infant; was naturalized 1906.

Veteran Legislator Dies in Seventh Term; Was Mayor, City Councilman

William N. Judd, 67, Republican state representative and former Clinton mayor, died at 7:10 p. m. Thursday in Iowa Lutheran hospital in Des Moines. His death came four days after he began his seventh term in the Iowa legislature.

He had been in critical condition at the hospital since suffering a heart attack about 2 a. m. Wednesday in his Des Moines hotel room. His son, Orrin and granddaughter, Mrs. John Kustes, were with him at the time of his death.

The body was to be in state today at Hamilton's funeral home in Des Moines and will be returned to the

Snell funeral home. Friends may call there beginning at 4 p. m. Saturday. At noon Monday the body will be taken to the First Presbyterian church, where Dr. Bruce McCullough will conduct services at 2 p. m. Masonic rites there will be in charge of Lyons lodge No. 93, A. F. & A. M. Burial will be in Springdale cemetery.

William Nelson Judd was born May 4, 1887, at Schuyler, Nebr., coming to Clinton when two years old with his parents, Marshall and Harriet Potter Judd. He attended local schools and entered the barber trade when he was 15.

Entering the service of the Chicago and North Western as a freight brakeman Dec. 17, 1906, he was promoted to conductor in 1913. He became terminal yardmaster at Belle Plaine in 1919 and was promoted to that position at Clinton in 1923. He retired in 1952 after 46 years with the railroad.

Rep. Judd's political career extended over a period of nearly 30 years and carried him from the Clinton council chambers to the Iowa Statehouse. He was a member of the Clinton city council between 1926 and 1934 and served as mayor of the city from 1944 to 1945. First elected as a state representative in 1936, he served four consecutive terms, losing out in a four-way primary battle for that post in 1948. He was reelected in 1950, in 1952 and in 1954.

The legislator was chairman of the house railroads committee during the 1953 legislature. He was a former part-time lobbyist for the state policemen's association.

Rep. Judd was married Jan. 4, 1906, to Katherine Paulsen, who preceded him in death May 10, 1951. His marriage to Olga Willke Herrick took place Dec. 9, 1952.

He was a member of First Presbyterian church, a life member of the American Railway Supervisors and the Iowa Association of Chiefs of Police and an honorary member of the Iowa State Sheriffs association and the Iowa Association of Firefighters, as well as a social member of the Iowa State Policemen's association. He was also affiliated with the following organizations: Lyons lodge No. 93, A. F. & A. M.; Royal Arch Masons of Iowa; Kaaba Shrine of Davenport; Clinton Shrine club, Clinton Elks lodge No. 199; Iowa Farm Bureau, Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, Veterans association of the Chicago and North Western, Clinton Hu-

Representing the senate will be Sens. David O. Shaff (R-Clinton), Jack Schroeder (R-Davenport), and Earl Elijah (R-Clarence).

Republicans Select Candidate

Clinton county voters will elect a successor to the late Representative William N. Judd at a special election to be called by Clinton County Board of Supervisors Leo A. Hoegh.

Candidates will be put in nomination by both major parties, the election to be made either by the county committee or at a county election.

Neither party chairman G. Rohwer of the Republicans or Democrat Eugene T. Burke have made any predictions today as to the candidates.

However, Burke said today that the Democrats have decided to have their candidate picked by the central committee.

Chairman Burke commended the size of a central committee of Democrats have 47 members, large enough to guarantee a democratic selection of a candidate that reconvening the court would be an unwieldy and expensive process.

Rohwer said his party has yet decided which procedure to follow, but added that he does not expect any formal announcement to be made until after Representative Judd's funeral.

Rohwer said the county board will formally notify the legislature of the legislator's death, after a date for the special election has been set.
