Here in Iowa, cloudy skies with isolated patches of rain spread over the state today and showers with possible thunderstorms were predicted for tonight.

The National Weather Service said Iowans can expect colder air for the period from Sunday through Tuesday.

Highs Thursday ranged from 61 at Dubuque and Lamoni to 65 at Spencer and Ames. Overnight lows varied from 46 at Burlington to 50 at

Ames, Lamoni, Ottumwa, Sioux City and Spencer.

The mercury is scheduled to drop into the low 40s tonight as shower activity continues.

The forecast for Saturday says it will be windy and colder with a chance of rain and highs from the low 50s northwest to the mid 60s southeast.

The extended forecast predicted it will be unseasonably cool Sunday through Tuesday with highs in the 50s to low 60s and lows in the 30s and 40s.
