Mirowski, was published in today's  
 issue of the New England Journal of  
 Medicine.

When people's hearts stop beating  
 regularly, medical technicians must  
 reach them within minutes with exter-  
 nally held shocking machines or they  
 will die. Sometimes, the help arrives  
 too late.

A new machine, about the size of a  
 package of cigarettes, delivers a shock  
 when it senses a specific kind of ar-  
 rhythmia, or abnormal heartbeat, call-  
 ed ventricular fibrillation.

During one seizure, the device can  
 deliver up to four blasts of electricity,  
 the last two more powerful than the  
 first two.

"It's a kind of protection that cur-  
 rently is not available to the high-risk  
 patient," Mirowski said in an inter-  
 view. "It provides services that are  
 available only in the coronary care  
 unit."

Mirowski noted that an external  
 defibrillator requires a team of techni-  
 cians who diagnose the problem and  
 then operate the machine.
