> POMEROY --- R. C. Berry, 76. prominent Pomeroy resident and former Calhoun county state representative, died Wednesday morning about 2:30 in Mercy hospital at Fort Dodge.

> Funeral arrangements, with the Michael funeral home of Pomeroy in charge, have not been completed as yet.

Mr. Berry was cashier of the Pomeroy State Bank for nearly 50 years, and was active in many community affairs. A republican, he served two terms in the state legislature at Des Moines, being first elected in 1948 and then reelected in 1950.

He was born in England on Nov. 8, 1876, and came with his parents, John and Mary Berry, to the United States when he was five years old.

Mr. Berry was reared on a farm in Pocahontas county and attended Pomeroy high school, Highland Park college in Des Moines and Business college Chillicothe at Chillicothe, Mo.

He entered the banking business in 1909 and was active until his retirement in 1947. During this period he served as cashier and vice president of the Pomeroy State Bank.

His marriage to Nellie Holmes took place in 1904. Mrs. Berry preceded him in death in 1944.

Mr. Berry was a member of the Pomeroy Methodist church, and a member of the Masonic lodge, Modern Woodmen and the Order of Eastern Star.

He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. L. E. Albrecht of Pomeroy: and three grandchildren.
