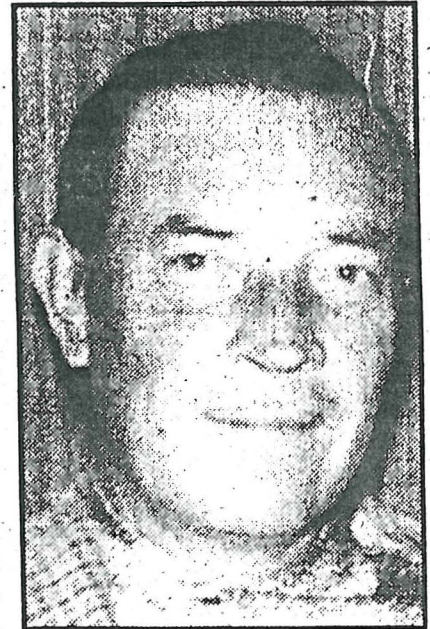

was also fraternally affiliated with the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and was Exalted Ruler of the Sioux City Lodge No. 112, in 1932-1933. He was a member of Phi Delta Theta, national social fraternity, and of Phi Delta Phi, national legal fraternity. Locally, Mr. Munger was a member of the Professional Men's Club. He was a member of the board of governors of the Lions Club, and an active member of the State University of Iowa Alumni Association. Professionally, he was identified with the bar associations of Woodbury County and the State of Iowa. Mr. Munger was a communicant of the First Congregational Church in Sioux City.

At Vermillion, South Dakota, June 8, 1904, Robert Howe Munger married Kathryn Belle Prentis, daughter of Charles Edwin and Mary Frances (Stanley) Prentis. Mr. and Mrs. Munger became the parents of two children: 1. Robert Prentis, born November 2, 1909. Of him a separate biographical sketch accompanies. 2. Stanley Prentis, born January 11, 1921.

On October 30, 1940, Robert Howe Munger died. His career will long be remembered by residents of Sioux City, and throughout the area of his judicial district, as exemplifying the highest standards of the bench and bar.

ROBERT PRENTIS MUNGER has been a lifelong resident of Sioux City. He established himself in law practice there in 1933, and has since become prominently identified also with business interests. He has combined public service with his career of personal achievement, having been elected to the State Senate as early as 1940.

Born in Sioux City on November 2, 1909, Robert Prentis Munger is the son of Robert Howe (q.v.) and Kathryn Belle (Prentis) Munger, both deceased. He prepared for higher education in the Sioux City High School, and matriculated at Morningside College, where he was graduated in 1931, with a Bachelor of Arts degree. For his professional studies he entered the University of South Dakota, receiving the degree of Bachelor of Laws, with the class of 1933. That same year Mr. Munger was admitted to the Iowa bar and launched a practice as an attorney in Sioux City. He had less than the usual young lawyer's difficulties in winning the confidence of the public, due to the more than thirty years his father had served the public both as private practitioner and as district judge.

Mr. Munger's name was well established among clients and colleagues at the time the United States became involved in World War II, and he then entered the United States Army. In August, 1942, he was commissioned a first lieutenant in the United States Army Air Corps, and called to active duty September 2, 1942. He served until November 27, 1945, when he was placed on inactive duty with the rank of major.

Upon returning to civilian life, Mr. Munger resumed his law practice in Sioux City, and became interested in various business ventures. He is a member of the American Bar Association and the Iowa State Bar Association. His college and professional fraternities include Delta Tau Delta and Phi Delta Phi. Politics became a major interest within a few years after he began to practice law in Sioux City, and he had the honor of being elected to the State Senate in 1940, resigning to enter the Air Corps. After returning from military service in World War II, he was sent to the House as representative in the Fifty-third General Assembly. He has sponsored and supported much progressive legislation,

and is presently serving as vice chairman of the commission for the reorganization of the state government established by the Fifty-third General Assembly.

Locally, Mr. Munger is a member of the Lions Club and of the American Legion, and is fraternally affiliated with the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, in which order he holds the Thirty-second degree, and with the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. He is a director of the Sioux City Art Center, and is a member of the Sioux City Club, and the Sioux City Boat Club, as well as the Professional Men's Club. Politics, flying and fishing may be considered his recreations. He attends the Congregational Church.

In 1934, Robert Prentis Munger married, first, Kathryn Bryce Gantt, who died in 1940. There was one child by this marriage: Robert Gantt. Mr. Munger married, second, at Sioux City, in 1941, Charlotte Louise Watkin, and they have two sons: Clark Watkin and John Francis.

WILLIAM ALEXANDER LANE, president of the Security Savings Bank of Marshalltown and one of Marshalltown's public-spirited citizens, was born September 19, 1884, in Waterloo, the son of Edgar C. and Eva A. Lane. His father was a banker.

William Alexander Lane attended the Guthrie Center, Iowa, High School and the Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey. He is a former member of the board of regents of the Graduate School of Banking, and also serves as chairman of the Iowa Bankers Association Agricultural Credit School in connection with Iowa State College at Ames, maintaining a keen and constant interest in the subject of education for the banking profession. Mr. Lane's first employment was as cashier of the First National Bank at Guthrie Center. He then became cashier of the First National Bank at Indianola, and later cashier of the First National Bank at Waterloo, before assuming his present office as president of the Security Savings Bank of Marshalltown. He is a member of the Country Bank Operations Commission of the American Bankers Association. Mr. Lane is former president of the East Waterloo board of education and a former member of the Marshalltown board of education. He is a past president of the Marshalltown Chamber of Commerce and at the present time is a member of the board of waterworks trustees of Marshalltown. A Kiwanian, he is a past president of this organization and has served as treasurer for twenty-five years. Fraternally he is affiliated with Blue Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, and with the Royal Arch Masons, Knights Templar and Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, holding the Thirty-second degree in the Masonic order. He is a member of the Twentieth Century Club. His religious ties are with the First Methodist Church of Marshalltown, where he serves as chairman of the official board.

On June 12, 1912 at Guthrie Center he was married to Abra E. Ford, the daughter of Horace C. and Nettie Ford. Mr. and Mrs. Lane have two children: 1. William A. Lane, Jr., born December 19, 1920. 2. Elizabeth Ellen Lane, born October 17, 1923, who is now Mrs. Ted Smith.
