



Ray E. Shepard was born on a farm in Appanoose County January 25, 1895, the son of David D. and Nancy Jane (Brown) Shepard. The family moved to Lucas County in 1910.

As a young man, he was asked by a neighbor to pick up Aunt Gladys Van Arsdale at the train depot in Russell. To his surprise, Aunt Gladys was an attractive young schoolteacher from Blandinsville, Illinois. Their courtship was postponed when Ray enlisted for the Army and volunteered for the American Expeditionary Forces in World War I and served in France. After a


In 1944 he was elected to the Iowa Legislature, serving in the Fifty-first and Fifty-second General Assemblies as Representative from Clayton County.


