Ike to Normandy For TV Filming

CAEN, FRANCE (AP)—Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower was back in France Tuesday to shoot more scenes for a television film on D-Day, 19 years and 2 months ago.

General Eisenhower stepped off a British destroyer at Cherbourg and returned to Caen where the film makers

Co. buses cost nearly \$151,000.

For the coming year, \$100,000 is budgeted for school-owned bus transportation; \$141,000 for transportation in public buses.

Costs Increase

School officials said transportation costs are increasing because families are moving to more remote areas of the city and more children have to be transported from crowded schools to schools where more classroom space is available.

The \$20,000 cut in the amount proposed for bus transportation was the only cut made by the board before approving the \$22.6 million budget proposed by Harris last month.

The budget calls for raising \$19,797,907 from local property taxes. This compares with \$19,063,832 raised by local school taxes for the past year.

The school tax rate for next year is estimated at 66.132 mills or \$66.13 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

\$99,000 this year because, board members said, the school system has been skimping on these items in recent years.

A public hearing on the budget was held during Tuesday's board meeting. The only person who spoke at the hearing was Charles J. Smith, chairman of the School Committee of the Polk-Des Moines Taxpayers Association.

"A Good Job"

Smith said the opinion of his committee was that school officials had done "a good job" on the budget and "we are perfectly willing to go along with the budget as it was presented."

The 1963-64 budget was adopted by unanimous vote of the school board.

AT TECH
