Foster, 80, Dies Monday

James W. Foster, 80, a former
 state representative from Monroe
 county, died Monday night at
 Davis County Hospital in Bloom-
 field. He had had a stroke Dec.
 28.

Foster was also a member of
 the State Soil Conservation Com-
 mittee from 1948 to 1960 and
 twice served as chairman. He
 was a former Monroe County
 Soil Conservation District com-
 missioner.

He was also a past-president of
 the Monroe County Farm Bureau
 and had been active in 4-H work.

He was chairman of the local
 Farm Debt Advisory Council dur-
 ing the depression years.

For many years he was a Sun-
 day school teacher at First
 Methodist Church in Albia.

He farmed four miles north of
 Albia.

The son of Samuel T. and
 Margaret A. Foster, he was born

On Zoning

A public hearing on the application of the Kness Manufacturing Co., Inc., to construct an apartment building on the property formerly owned by the Friends Church will be held Wednesday evening, Jan. 13, at 7:30 o'clock at the Albia City Hall.

The hearing is being scheduled by the Board of Zoning Adjustment under the new zoning ordinance adopted by the City of Albia the past year.

The property, located on the northeast corner of the intersection of N. Clinton St. and B Ave. W., was owned for many years by the Friends Church and was used for church purposes until recently.

The Albia Planning and Zoning Commission had held a meeting in December and recommended the granting of the permission to the Kness Manufacturing Co., but the Board of Zoning Adjustment must hold a public hearing on the application before a decision is made.

The property concerned is located in an R-1 residential area, an area normally reserved for single family and two family dwellings, schools, and churches.

Apartments, motels and hotels are limited to C-1 business or commercial districts, under the ordinance, unless variances are approved by the zoning bodies.

Fred Hanks, 83, Dies Tuesday

Fred Hanks, 83, of Tracy died suddenly Tuesday at Ottumwa Hospital.

He was born Feb. 7, 1881, in Illinois, the son of George and America Beatty Hanks and attended elementary schools in Illinois. He was married Aug. 2, 1904, to Myrtle Woods of Knoxville. They lived all their married life in Marion and Monroe counties, and lived in Tracy for the past 30 years. He was a coal miner until he retired 18 years ago.

Surviving are his widow; a daughter, Mrs. Alfred (Mildred) Swinsee of Ottumwa; a son, Fred William Hanks of Troutdale, Ore.; a brother, Howard Hanks of Troy, Ill.; six grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a son, Howard, who was killed in 1945 while in military service; and three brothers.

The funeral will be Friday at 3 p.m. at the Zimmerman Funeral Home in Lovilia with the Rev. Dean Timm, pastor of the Lovilia Methodist Church, officiating. Burial will be in Bellefontaine cemetery at Tracy.
