DES MOINES, Iowa (AP)—
Iowa Power and Light Co.
should reduce its rates instead
of asking that they be in-
creased by \$5.2 million a year,
a utility consultant has testified
before the Iowa Commerce
Commission.

The consultant, Robert G.
Towers of Washington, D.C.,
told the ICC Tuesday that Iowa
Power should reduce its elec-
tricity rates by \$2 million.

Towers said his study of the
firm's expenditures reveals
that Iowa Power is earning 7.13
per cent a year on its in-
vestment.

A fair return on investment,
said Towers, would be 6.5 per
cent, which he said shows that
the utility is already collecting
too much for its electricity.

The ICC is conducting the
hearing on the proposed rate
increase. Towers is employed
by a consulting firm hired by
the city of Des Moines and oth-
ers who are opposing the pro-
posed hike.

Iowa Power and Light
provides service to Colfax,

Monroe, Prairie City and
Mingo in Jasper County.

The commission was told by
Iowa Power officials earlier
that if the electricity rate in-
crease is approved, the firm
will receive only a 6.9 per cent
return on its investment.

Company officials have said
they believe 8.0 per cent would
be a better return.

Towers disputed several cost
figures used by Iowa Power in
its request.

He said that in 1961 the
firm's labor costs were \$.0044
for each kilowatt-hour of elec-
tricity produced. He said in
1970 this had dropped by 35 per
cent to about \$.0028.

Iowa Power has claimed that
increasing labor costs are one
reason the rate increase is nec-
essary.

Towers also claimed that in
the first seven months of 1971,
labor costs had continued to
drop in relation to each kilo-
watt-hour of electricity pro-
duced by the firm.

He also maintained that fuel
cost estimates used by Iowa
Power are excessive.

"So far, we've been in a defensive battle, reorganizing," he said. "We'll do something."

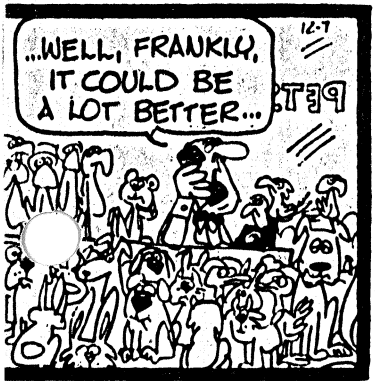
He refused to discuss casualties.

An Indian corps commander told the United Nations that Indian troops had advanced all along the fire line dividing Kashmir, except for a tactical withdrawal in the Chhamb sector.

The Indians claimed to have destroyed 35 medium tanks in Kashmir and admitted to the loss of 15.

The spokesman said that Indian forces in the Chhamb sector had fallen back to positions on the east bank of the Tawi River "while my forces remain on the banks." However, a spokesman in Rawalpindi claimed that the Pakistanis had crossed the river.
