Lewis Wilson, prominent businessman dies at 89

ared after mmercial of Eagle was badly nent con-Lewis E. Wilson, prominste Eagle Grove businessman and former state representative, died Dec. 23 at the age of 89. Funeral services were held Thursday.

He live ' in Eagle Grove from 1902 until May of 1979, 77 years, before he moved to the Clarion Care Center. After graduation from Eagle Grove high school, Wilson taught school in Troy Township for a year, then went into the furniture and funeral business in Eagle Grove in 1969. In the early 1930's the furniture part of the business was dropped and he devoted' full time to the funeral portion of the business. He continued in the mortuary work until his retirement in 1974

In 1974 he was elected state representative for Wright County and was re-elected for a second term.

Wilson became the unofficial historian of Eagle Grove after his retirement. He researched and wrote histories of the churches, schools, businesses, politicians and people.

His church, the United Methodist Church, occupied considerable amount of his time throughout his life. Wilson had held every office in the church. At the time of his death





OBITUARY

Lewis Elmer Wilson was born Feb. 23, 1889 on a ranch in Polk County, Neb. At the age of 13 his family moved to New Virginia, Iowa. In 1902 the Wilson family moved to Eagle Grove where Lewis lived until May of 1979 at which time his health necessitated his moving to the Clarion Care Center, Clarion, where he lived until his passing on Dec. 23, 1979.

Lewis graduated from Eagle Grove High School with the class of 1908. While in school he was active in debate, track, baseball and football.

After graduation he taught school at District No. 6 in Troy Township. In 1909 he was appointed assistant postmaster at Eagle Grove. In 1919 Wilson and Fred Foll of Eagle Grove purchased the Eagle Grove Furniture Store and Funeral Business which they operated until the depression of the early 1930's, Wilson then started in the exclusive funeral business which he operated until his retirement.
