C. A. Bryson, 77, County Leader, Dies Saturday

Final rites were held Monday afternoon in the Home for Funerals, Iowa Falls; for C. A. Bryson, who died at the age of 77 Saturday in a Rochester, Minn., hospital following an illness of several weeks.

Mr. Bryson was well-known throughout the county, having practiced as an attorney in Iowa Falls since 1924. He was chairman of the Hardin County Republican Central committee for 22 years, served as representative from Hardin county in the state legislature for three terms, and was county attorney from 1910 to 1916.

Born in Ackley, he graduated from Drake university, Des Moines, in 1897. He was a member of the Maconic lodge and Rotary club, Iowa Falls, and past state commander of the Sons of Union Veterans.

Surviving are the widow, one daughter, Mrs. Paul Jones, Sr., Iowa Falls; two sons, Philip, Ironwood, Mich., and Robert of Moonpark, Calif.
