Will Set Date For New Community School District In May

The adjourned meeting of the Boone County Board of Education was held at the high school Tuesday evening, April 16, and acted on the objections of the two land owners in the Little Beaver district who wished to be excluded from the new Ogden community school district which is being formed.

The date for the forthcoming election will be set by the board and official notice will appear in the Ogden Reporter next week. It is hoped to hold this election some time early in May, when citizens in the rural and town areas which are included, will be asked to approve the new district.

Full details of the new district, which is being formed to comply with laws and regulations as set forth by the General Assembly of the state will be brought to our readers in next week's edition of the Reporter.

Citizens who have made a study of the problem, are certain that the new community school district, which will serve, all of the present tuition and regular pupils of the district, will help equalize the taxes in the area and will comply with the new law and regulations.

Voters who wish added information will find school officials and interested citizens who have studied this problem, more than willing to give all full details about the future of this proposed district.

Mr. Good, 84, died at his home in Boone Monday evening, April 15. He had been ill since last fall.

Born Aug. 15, 1872, near Pilot Mound, most of his life had been spent on a farm in the Ogden community, until he retired and moved to Boone about 10 years ago.

Survivors include two daughters and a son, Mrs. Raymond (Mabel) Vogler, Mrs. Glenn (Lucille) Treloar, and Lester Good, all of Ogden; five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Minnie Wolfe of Fort Dodge and Mrs. Anna Dockrey of Pilot Mound. His wife's death preceded his six years ago.

Mr. Good served five terms in the Iowa Legislature, as a Representative from Boone County. Internationally known as a breeder of Belgian horses, he imported them from France and Belgium and sold them in Canada, Mexico and Hawaii. He was recognized judge of Belgian horses and judged at horse shows throughout the United States and Canada, appearing at the Toronto Royal Show many times.

He and his son, Lester, showed in as many as 15 fairs and expositions in a year throughout

Resealing For 1955—! Is Announ

A resealing program supported 1955 has been authorized by the State Department, it was reported by John Daws, Boone county treasurer.

The resealing year will apply 1956 corn plantings or "loans and payments by May 31 and still on the farm. No provision has been made for further extension of the 1956 crop loans on 1957.

Farmers who their loans will another year in it to the 1957. Those 1956-crop loans chase agreements into loans will payment of 16 at the end of the July 31, 1958.

Farmers who 1955-crop resale receive a storage cents per bushel resale period (time they extend another year an additional storage cents per bushel the extended period if they hold the period. Producers or part of their seal or extended July 31, 1958. The rated storage price is 1.00 per bushel. Those who have the right to resale any time, and government is earn a storage price. Eligibility requires the 1956-crop extension of the 1955 loans are the original loan.
