Hugh W. Lundy dies today

Hugh Warnock Lundy, 83, an Albia attorney for 52 years, died early today at St. Joseph's Hospital in Ottumwa.

He was born August 23, 1893, at Springhill, the son of James W. and Anna Peverley Lundy.

Lundy was married to June Skinner. She preceded him in death July, 1967.

Lundy received his law degree from Drake University in Des Moines after previously earning degrees from Simpson College in Indianola and the University of Pennsylvania.

He came to Albia as principal of the Albia High School in 1918 and was employed in that role until 1925 when he turned to his law practice fulltime. Lundy continued to officiate in high school sports and was a referee at the first state girls basketball tournament.

During his law career, he was active in politics. Lundy has served as city attorney for the past 32 years. He served as a member of the Iowa Legislature from 1937 to 1949, including four years in the House of Representatives and eight years in the Iowa Senate. He was Monroe County Republican chairman for 14

years and was a delegate to several national nominating conventions.

Lundy was a fifty-year member of the Masons, Chapter, and Zerubbabel Commandry. He was also a member of Kaaba Shrine Temple, Rotary Club and Trinity United Methodist Church.

He was presently serving as a trustee of the Albia Public Library and had served as a trustee of Simpson College. Lundy had been secretary of the Iowa Coal Institute and a member of the Greater Iowa Commission.

Surviving are one daughter, Mrs. Lorraine Knight of Berwyn, Penn.; one granddaughter; two great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mrs. Helen Whitnah of Wayzata, Minn.

The funeral service is tentatively scheduled for Saturday afternoon at Trinity United Methodist Church with Rev. Jerry Brown officiating. Burial will be in Oak View Cemetery.
