On March 4, 1898 he was united in marriage to Josephine Rodgers. To this union two children, Allen and Alice were born. This family preceded him in death.

On April 4, 1912, he was united in marriage to Mable Mae Barr. To this union 11 children were born. William, who died in infancy, Corilla of Los Angeles, Calif., Howard of Irving, Texas, Harold of Chariton, Mrs. Harriette Goodrich and Mrs. Ruth Butler of Lacona, Len, also of Lacona, John of Irving, Texas, Mrs. Anna Bray of Des Moines, Mrs. Esther De Vos of Miles City, Mont., and Robert, now in the U. S. Marine Corps, stationed at Oceanside, Calif. His wife preceded him in death on Sept. 24, 1932.

Besides his children he leaves five grandsons and four granddaughters, one nephew and two nieces.

Hal, as he was known to his friends, was for 50 years a member of the Masonic Lodge.

He leaves behind the strong will and courage and real sense of humor that carried him through a long and useful life.

James Alonzo Newsome

James Alonzo Newsome, the eldest son of the late Wright and Harriet (Williams) Newsome was born Aug. 6, 1878 on the farm near Derby where he departed this life on Nov. 14, 1952 at the age of 72 years, three months and eight days.

Preceding him in death were not only his parents, but also three brothers, Dr. George, Fred, and Roy.

On Sept. 25, 1912 he was married to Mary Elizabeth Taylor. For many years previous he had taught in the schools of Lucas county, but after his marriage his time was devoted to agricultural pursuits.

Mr. Newsome was always interested in community activities giving liberally of his time. He helped organize the Derby District Agricultural association and was one of the first officers. He was active in the work of the Lucas County Farm Bureau, at one time serving as president. He also represented the community in the State Legislature, serving as both Representative and Senator.

Surviving are his devoted wife, a son, Wright of Derby, a daughter, Mrs. Chas. Crawford of Leon, a sister, Mrs. D. C. Johnson of Derby, five granddaughters, Charlotte, Virginia and Norma Crawford of Leon, Mary Helen and Rebecca Newsome of Derby, other relatives and a host of friends.

The body was removed from the Beardsley funeral home and taken to the house Monday morning.

Services will be held at the Last Chance church in Union township, the Rev. J. E. Clark of Derby, officiating. Burial was made in the family plot in Last Chance ceme-

JAMES A. NEWSOME

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee, appointed to prepare suitable resolutions commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable James A. Newsome, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

James A. Newsome was born near Last Chance, Lucas County, Iowa, August 6, 1878, and died at Derby, Iowa, November 14, 1952, at the age of 74 years.

He received his formal education in the schools of Lucas County and at Iowa State College, and taught in the rural schools of Lucas and Clark Counties for ten years. For many years he was president of the school board and also served on the County Board of Education.

Ever since its origin he has been active in the Farm Bureau and served as a director and president. He was one of the organizers of the Derby District Agricultural Association and the Derby District Fair and was its first secretary. He was a director and past treasurer of the Lucas County Mutual Fire Insurance Company and also served on the Cemetery Board. He was a member of A.F. & A.M. and I.O.O.F.

In 1912 he was married to Mary E. Taylor of Lucas County, and to this union were born a son and a daughter.

Mr. Newsome served the State of Iowa as a representative in the Forty-fifth General Assembly and the Fiftieth Extra and was sent to the Fifty-first and Fifty-second General Assemblies as senator from the Fourth District.
