Pepsico buys 7-Up

NEW YORK (AP) — Pepsico Inc.,
parent of the world's No. 2 soft-drink
producer, said today it has reached an
agreement to buy the international
unit of rival Seven-Up Co. from Philip
Morris Cos. for \$246 million in cash.
The company earlier had announced
plans to buy both the domestic and
foreign operations of Seven-Up for
\$80 million, but the Federal Trade
Commission said it opposed the deal.

Philip Morris subsequently ended that
agreement.

Pepsico said the purchase of
Seven-Up's international operations,
completed Friday, doesn't require
government approval. Philip Morris
still intends to sell Seven-Up's U.S.
operations.

Pepsico will increase its overseas
volume of 1.4 billion cases by 250
million cases through the purchase.

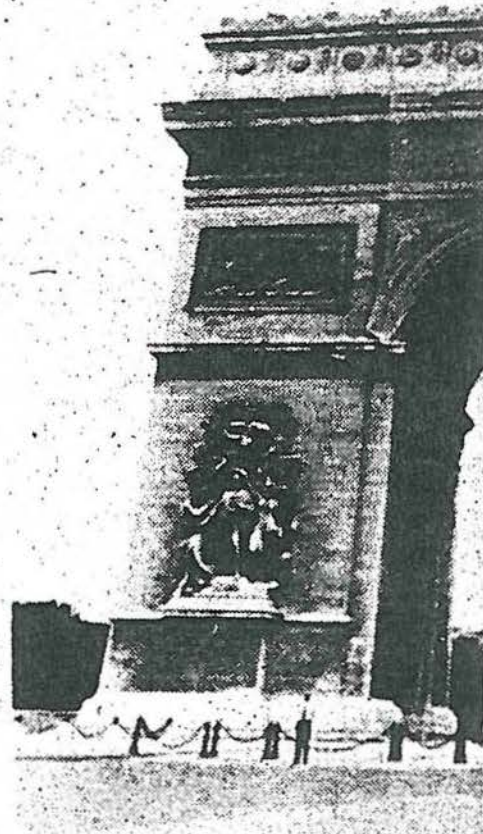

Andrew J. Nielsen, 97, a former state legislator and municipal judge, died Saturday at a local care center.

Mr. Nielsen was born in Omaha. His family moved to Persia when he was a child. He was a Methodist pastor until entering the service in World War I. During his time in the service, he became involved in aviation.

He worked as a pilot and aviation teacher while studying law at Creighton and Omaha universities. He was admitted to the Nebraska bar in 1925.

In 1933 he began a law practice in Council Bluffs and later served several terms in the Iowa state legislature. At one time he served as acting city and county attorney. Mr. Nielsen was elected a municipal court judge, retiring in 1966.

He was a member of the Offutt chapter of the Retired Officers Association, the American Legion, the 40 & 8, the Fraternal Order of Eagles and the bar association.

Mr. Nielsen's survivors include his wife, Catherine Peet Nielsen of Council Bluffs; a son, Paul of Los Angeles, Calif.; and a daughter, Bertha Thompson of Simi Valley, Calif.
