Clarification of a certain part of the ordinance was made by at a special meeting Monday, May 4, when a representative of Selander and Associates of Omaha was present to study the objection of an Exira citizen who felt certain property was designated in a commercial area when it should be "residential". Jerry Wahlert was hired as a new employee and will lean operation of the water plant.

The town will notify property owners in regard to mowing vacant lots. The town has been doing this but owners who request this service will have to pay in advance.

Peter A. Jessen Laid To Rest Saturday

Final rites for Peter A. Jessen, were held at 2:00 p. m. Saturday at the Exira Lutheran church.

Mr. Jessen, 72, was an oil jobber here for many years. A veteran of World War I, he served with the Army Air Corps. He was a member of the Exira Lutheran church, the Masonic Lodge, American Legion and served as representative in the Iowa Legislature.

He was married Oct. 17, 1922 to Helena Nelson and they lived their entire married life in the Exira community.

Surviving besides his wife is a daughter, Mrs. Lowell (Virginia) Kraatz of Arroyo Grande, Calif. four grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Elvin H. Petersen of Exira and Mrs. Ernest Nelson of Des Moines; two brothers, Elmer Jessen of Exira and Andrew Jessen of Summerville, W. Va. He was preceded in death by a son, Second Lt. Fred N. Jessen, who was killed in action on Okinawa June 8, 1945 and a granddaughter, Linda Kraatz, who died July 24, 1957.

Funeral services were held Saturday at the Exira Lutheran church with the Rev. Stanley Hansen officiating.

The congregation, accompanied by the organist, Mrs. Fred Nelson sang: "Abide With Me", and "Nearer My God To Thee".

Casketbearers were Charles N. Petersen, Harvey Jensen, Richard Nelson, Harold Jessen, Ted Simpson and Kenneth Struble.

Interment was in the Exira cemetery. Carl's Funeral home had charge of arrangements.
