## Last rites held for Erma C. Christians

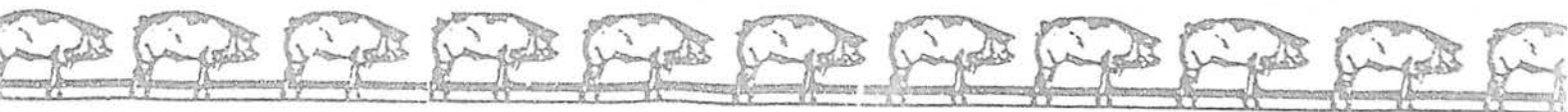
