Oscar E. Johnson rites on Tuesday

Oscar E. Johnson, 74, state senator and representative, and former mayor of Kanawha, died of a heart attack Saturday while on vacation near Cloquet, Minn.

Funeral services were held Tuesday at 2 p. m. at Kanawha Lutheran Church. The Rev. Bernard Oebser officiated. Burial was at Amsterdam Township cemetery with Carler Funeral Home in charge.

Born March 22, 1895, at Dayton, Iowa, he was the son of August and Emily Johnson. He was graduated from Dayton High School in 1912 and from the Highland Park School in Pharmacy in Des Moines in 1915.

He was married to Nora Nelson in Garner Dec. 29, 1937. He had served as an Army medical corpsman during World War I, was active in Kanawha Lutheran Church, Masonic Lodge, the Shrine in Des Moines, served as mayor here 12 years and as state representative and state senator 10 years.

He was on the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners 15 years and in 1965 was named honorary president of the National Board of Pharmacy Examiners. He was a 50-year-member of the Iowa Pharmaceutical Association, was on the board of directors of the Hancock County Memorial Hospital, the Farmers State Bank of Kanawha and the Northwestern Drug Company of Minneapolis. He was president of the Norway Rural Telephone Company in Kanawha.

Surviving are his wife, two sons, James, Green Bay, Wis.; William, Belmond; a brother, Bill, Albuquerque, N. M.; and five grandchildren.

Lawrence Eckhoff completes training

FT. GORDON, GA. (AP)— Army Private Lawrence J. Eckhoff, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herb G. Eckhoff of Kanawha completed nine weeks of advanced infantry training July 19 at Ft. Gordon. His last week of training was in guerrilla warfare exercise.

During his guerrilla training lived under simulated Vietnam conditions for five days, fighting night attacks and conducting operations on "enemy" villages. He was to use methods of removing booby traps, setting ambushes and avoiding enemy ambushes.

Other specialized training included small unit tactics, mapping, land mine warfare, communications, and firing the M-16 rifle, machine gun and the 82 rocket launcher.
