SUN CITY, ARIZ. — David A. Dancer, former executive secretary of the Iowa state Board of Regents and a former member of the Iowa Legislature, died Monday at a Sun City hospital of a heart ailment. He was 86.

A native of Lamoni, Ia., Mr. Dancer was a farmer who served four terms as a Republican in the Iowa House of Representatives. In 1942 he was named secretary of the regents, a position he held until 1968. He then served as director of alumni relations for the Des Moines College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery for two years. A 1917 graduate of the University of Iowa, he received the school's distinguished service award in 1964. He was a member of the alumni associations at the University of Iowa and Iowa State University. He also served on the Lamoni City Council for 10 years and was a member of the board of directors of the Farmers Grain and Seed Co., and was chairman of the board of the Lamoni Cooperative Creamery Association. Dancer Hall, a dormitory at the University of Northern Iowa, is named for Mr. Dancer.

Survivors include his wife, Florence; three daughters, Alice White of Sun City, Ariz., JoAnn Stone of Backus, Minn., and Jane Tipken of Austin, Texas; six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Services will be held at 1 p.m. Thursday at Menke Funeral Home in Sun City. Burial will be at Sunland Memorial Park here.

Cesar Chavez's father dies at 100

SAN JOSE, CALIF. (AP) — Librado Hernandez Chavez, a longtime migrant workers' advocate and father of United Farm Workers founder, Cesar Chavez, died Tuesday at the age of 100, a family spokesman said.

Chavez, born Aug. 17, 1882, homesteaded a small farm near Yuma in southwestern Arizona, where he raised his family. He supplemented his income by driving stagecoaches and 20-mule teams in California and Arizona when the harvest was poor.

He lost the farm to a bank during the Great Depression, and moved his family to California, where he, his wife and five children worked as migrant farm laborers, traveling the state to follow the crops.

Chavez was active in three migrant worker unions that preceded the UFW, which was founded by Cesar Chavez in the 1950s.
