# Deadline On ing Ad Tax

Director William H. Forst advised last week that as a result of the decision to appeal the advertising tax, case number 10 is to be mailed to all sales tax units in the media categories setting out requirements for reporting the sales tax, as tax on all advertising receipts and on service and binding receipts, on service rendered since October 1, 1967, must be reported on the "B-69" quarterly sales and tax reports due to be filed with the department on or before July 31, 1969.

The department will be demanding payment on this report whether or not individual advertisers have remitted tax to the media advertising agencies.

It was announced that no penalty would be assessed upon the advertising receipts if they are filed with the report due July 31, 1969. Interest must be paid, however, on these receipts from May 1, 1969 the date the first receipts were due after the Iowa Supreme Court injunction was listed, January 15, 1969. The report must include taxable receipts from October 1, 1967 not previously reported on all sales tax and interest on such receipts.

# Attorney And Former State Senator Dies

Edward P. Donohue, 70, longtime New Hampton attorney and former State Senator from Chickasaw County died Sunday, June 22, at a Rochester, Minn., hospital, where he had been a patient for three weeks.

Attorney Donohue, a senior member of the law firm Donohue, Wilkins and Donohue, had practiced law in New Hampton since 1904, upon his graduation from the State University of Iowa, Iowa City.

He was Chickasaw County Attorney from 1930 to 1934 and was elected to the State Senate in 1934 where he was Senate Majority Leader during his service in the legislature until 1938.

Attorney Donohue was a charter member of the New Hampton Rotary Club and also was a member of the American Legion, Elks Club, Chamber of Commerce, the American Bar Association, Iowa State Bar Association and the Chickasaw County Bar Association. He also was a member of the Board of Directors of the New Hampton Volunteer Fire Department.

Edward P. Donohue was born March 18, 1899, at Iowa City, the son of Daniel and Julia Donohue. On June 8, 1924, he was married to Edna (Snick) Grimm. The couple had since made their home in New Hampton.

Besides his wife, survivors include a son, Attorney Richard Donohue of West Union; five grandchildren; and three brothers, Dr. Louis Donohue of Iowa City, Dr. Leonard Donohue of Muscatine and Joseph Donohue of Fond du Lac, Wis.

Last rites will be at 10 a.m. Wednesday, June 25, from St. Joseph's Catholic Church, New Hampton.

Larkin-Martin Funeral Service of New Hampton has charge of arrangements, and friends may call at the chapel after 2-30 Tuesday (today).
