# Howard Eckerman; Retired Lawyer

Services for Howard P. Eckerman, 64, Philadelphia, Pa., who formerly resided at 3114 Crestline Drive, Davenport, will be 1 p.m. Monday in the Hill & Fredericks Chapel, Davenport. Burial will be in Davenport Memorial Park where Davenport Masonic Lodge 37 will conduct services.

Visitation is after 2 p.m. Sunday at the mortuary.

Mr. Eckerman died Wednesday in Philadelphia.

He was admitted to the bar in 1936. He started his law practice in Davenport with Matthew Hart in 1937. From 1960 until retiring from active practice in 1970 he was with Eckerman, McFerren, Fair and McGrath.

Mr. Eckerman served two terms, 1939-41, in the Iowa House of Representatives.

He was born in Centerville, Iowa, moving to Davenport in 1910. He married Florence Lewis in 1933 in Annapolis, Md.

Mr. Eckerman was a member of the Iowa State Bar Assn., and a member and past president of the Scott County Bar
