Park Receives New Name

The name of Palo Alto County's new, enlarged park on Lost Island Lake north of Ruthven will be, Lost Island - Huston Park.

This was decided by the Palo Alto County Conservation Board at a recent meeting at Ruthven. Signs with the official name will be erected at entrances to the park in 1965 when many other improvements will be made.

The LOST ISLAND part of the name was retained from Lost Island State Park, name of the original site established on the east shoreline years ago and familiar to hundreds of picnickers and other outdoor fans.

The old area comprises 25 acres. The new addition adjoining the old area on the north consists of 44 acres and was recently acquired by the Board. For years it was owned by the late Dr. Herbert Mark Huston of Ruthven, a prominent and popular physician in the community more than fifty years.

Dr. Huston began practicing medicine in Ruthven in the late 80's, and his practice extended over a wide area.

Plans for 1965 in the new area includes a bathhouse and swimming area at the natural sand beach in the north end, a ramp for launching boats, suitable space for tent campers as well as those with trailer homes, a well for drinking water and restrooms.
