Funeral services for Emery Hemingway, 81, a lifelong resident of the West Branch area, were held at the West Branch Friends church Feb. 13 with the Rev. Edward English officiating. Burial was at Oasis.

Mr. Hemingway died at his farm home near Oasis in Johnson county Feb. 11.

Born Sept. 7, 1891 near Centerdale, he was the son of Albert Negus and Ada Adams Hemingway. He was a graduate of West Branch High School and was married in 1918 to Etta Coulter at Iowa City.

He was a retired farmer and had been active in the Johnson County Farm Bureau and Cedar County and State Historical associations. He was a member of the West Branch Friends Church.

Mr. Hemingway was a distant cousin of President Richard Nixon. Mr. Hemingway and President Nixon are great-grandsons of Hope Hemingway, who lived in West Branch.

Gordon Smith Services Held At Clarence

Last rites for Gordon Smith, 69, Clarence, former state legislator, county coroner and mayor of Clarence, were held at the United Methodist church, Clarence, Feb. 12. The Rev. Charles McNeely, Martelle and the Rev. James Lusher, Clarence, officiated.

Pallbearers were Glen Jensen, Owen Slaymaker, Hans Christiansen, John Hoffner, Raymond Doermann and Dale Struthers. Honorary pallbearers were Elwood Kirkpatrick, Lester Kelly, Wayne Saunders, Harry Decker and Paul Busching. Marjorie Lacock was organist and Dillon Holcomb, soloist.

Eveadell Brink, Mrs. Elwood Kirkpatrick and Mrs. Wilbert Wiebke were in charge of flowers. Burial was in the Clarence cemetery where Masonic rites were conducted.

Mr. Smith died at St. Luke's hospital, Cedar Rapids, Feb. 9. He had been aken by ambulance to the hospital Feb. 8 after suffering a heart attack.

The son of Charles and Sarah Andersen Smith, he was born at Clarence July 27, 1903 and was married to Elsa Bowers at Waterloo June 16, 1926.

Active in Republican politics most of his life, Mr. Smith served in the Iowa legislature for 2 terms. He defeated LaMar Foster, 3,198 to 2,792 in 1938 and Ed F. Walshire, 5,058 to 2,988, in 1940. He was Cedar county coroner from Aug. 26, 1946 to Dec. 31, 1952.

Mr. Smith also served as mayor of Clarence in 1945 and 1946.

He was active as a lay minister, speaking at church and at funeral services throughout the Cedar county area. He was also a popular speaker on the history of Iowa and Cedar county. His knowledge of the history of the Cedar county area was considered unrivaled and he had several articles published in the Cedar County historical review. He was considered "the authority" on the history of his area.

He maintained an office in Clarence where he conducted a variety of professional and business services and was active in the preparation of income tax returns at the time of his death.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, the Oddfellows and the Cedar County Historical society.

He is survived by his wife, 2 sons, Barton, Casper, Wyo., and Forrest, Oakland, Calif., and 3 grandchildren.

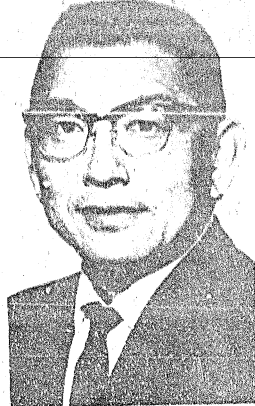

Minoru Amemiya Speaks at Tillage Meeting Feb. 20

This may be the year to try minimum tillage or reduced operation, stated Ken Muller, Cedar county extension director. Few farmers got much work done last fall and spring plowing time may be limited by high moisture levels.

Surface residues and tillage systems are also important in controlling erosion, added Muller.

Advantages and problems of the various tillage systems will be discussed at the tillage meeting to be held in Tipton Tuesday, Feb. 20. The meeting will be held at Egert Hall (Catholic church) from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Advance registration for the meeting is not needed.

Speakers will be: Jeff Anliker, Cedar county soil conservation service; Mike Zech, Ortho company; Minoru Amemiya, Iowa State University extension agronomist; and Jerry Gogan, extension crop production specialist.

Topics covered by the speakers will include: Conservation tillage trends in Cedar county; how far can we go with reduced tillage; does it cut costs without sacrificing yields; what about a wet year like 1972; fertility placement, weed control, insects and seed beds will also be discussed by agronomist.

Farmers who have tried minimum tillage or conservation methods will be asked to explain how their system works for them. Surface mulch is a big factor in soil conservation, stated

When officers arrived at the scene Butler could not be found and a search of the area was made without finding him. He appeared the next morning.

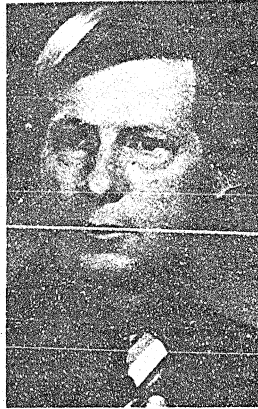
The van was a total loss and Butler escaped with a cut lip.

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character, and public service of the late Honorable Gordon Smith, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Gordon Smith was born in Clarence, Iowa in Cedar County on July 27, 1903. He was the son of Charles and Sarah (Anderson) Smith. He graduated from Clarence High School in 1920 and from Iowa State Teachers College in 1924. He later did post-graduate work at Drake University.

Mr. Smith married Alsa Bowers in Waterloo on June 16, 1928. To this union were born two sons.

Mr. Smith served as minister for several churches in eastern Iowa after his marriage. He maintained an office in Clarence where he was active in the preparation of income tax returns at the time of his death.

Mr. Smith was a life-long member of the Christian Church and also held membership in the Mount Hope Masonic Lodge at Clarence, and the Manitou Odd Fellows Lodge at Tipton. He was a charter member of the Cedar County Historical Society as well as a board member, and a life member of the State Historical Society. He was a writer for the Historical Society and for various church magazines.

Mr. Smith, as a member of the Republican Party, served in the House of Representatives during the Forty-eighth and Forty-ninth sessions of the General Assembly from Cedar County. He also served as mayor of Clarence, Iowa in 1945 and as Cedar County Coroner from August 28, 1946 to December 31, 1952.

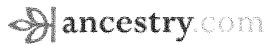
