Two Car Accidents In County Last Week

Pocahontas—County Sheriff Kenneth Richardson reported that the county had its first automobile accidents for about three weeks recorded last week-end. About 11 a.m. Saturday there was a collision of two cars on a county road two miles south of Plover. One car was driven by Nathan Orth, 54, of Plover who had picked up his mail and pulled into the intersection in the path of a car driven by Fletcher Pringle, 84, of Plover. The Orth car was headed east and the Pringle car was going north when the accident took place. Mr. Pringle was taken to a Mallard physician's office for examination after which he returned home. Car damage totaled \$600 to \$700. S. S. Davidson, Pocahontas county deputy sheriff, investigated.

The second accident took place Sunday afternoon at about 1:45 o'clock five and a half miles north of the junction of 3 and 17 at Pocahontas. This was a one car accident and involved a 1949 model car driven by James E. Slattery, 19, of Laurens who was accompanied by Thomas E. Brown, 19, also of Laurens. The young men indicated that a car defect may have caused their car to go out of control and hit a bridge which completely tore off the right side of the car. The car traveled 90 to 100 feet south and stopped on the shoulder of the road headed north.
