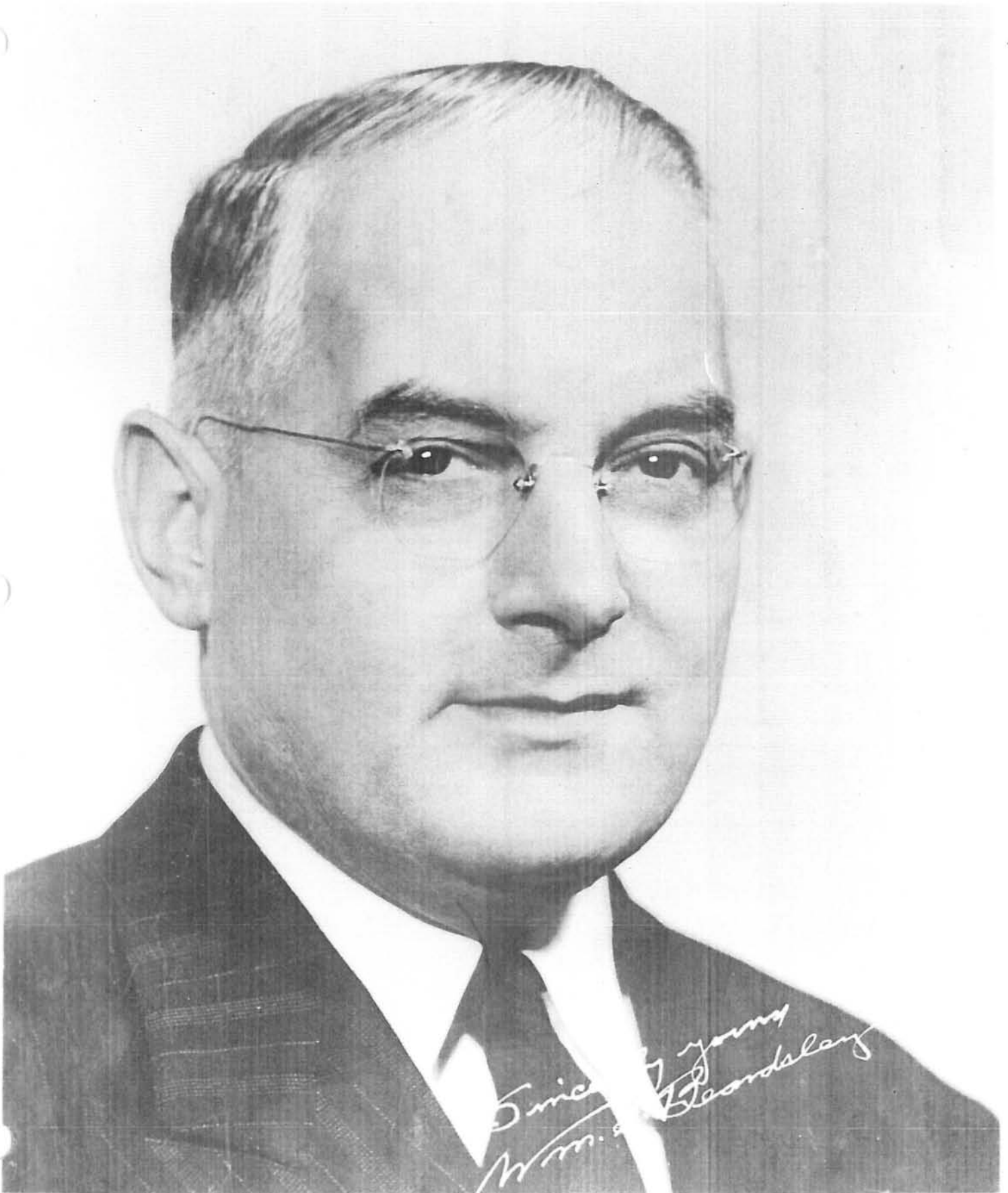

# Iowa's Governor Dies In Auto Crash Sunday Night

Shocked is a mild word to express the feelings of the entire state and nation when it was learned that Iowa's Governor William Shane Beardsley was dead. He met death in an car-truck crash about a mile north of Des Moines on Highway 60 in which officials state was entirely unavoidable. Mrs. Beardsley received painful injuries and is reported as doing nicely at Iowa Lutheran hospital. Governor Beardsley was dead on arrival at the hospital and death was due to a crushed chest.

The Governor and Mrs. Beardsley were enroute to Des Moines from Ames when the accident happened. The panel truck involved in the accident was also enroute to Des Moines and was driven by John Gardner, of Des Moines.

Governor Beardsley was a strong advocate of highway safety and it is tragic that he should have met his death in a highway mishap. It was just one of those things that can happen to any-

The body will lie in state at the state house in Des Moines from 2 to 4 P. M., Tuesday, November 23rd after which it will be brought to the Governor's farm home near New Virginia. The body will later be brought to the Methodist church where it will lie in state from 11 A. M., until 1 P. M. Funeral services will be at 2:30 P. M., at the church with burial in the family plot in the New Virginia cemetery.

His son, Blaine and family, arrived in Des Moines by plane from their home in Hillsboro, Oregon, about 2:30 Monday afternoon. A daughter, Mrs. Henry F. Schieg and Mr. Schieg and daughter arrived in Des Moines early Monday after an all night drive from their home at Appleton, Wisconsin. Their son, Dan, a student at Ames, and Mrs. Charlotte Stickel and Mr. Stickel and son, Tommy, besides Mrs. Beardsley are the immediate members of the family.

Funeral services in New Virginia were attended by large crowds. As the body lie in state at the Methodist church neighbors and friends from all over Iowa filed past the casket for a last look at the man they knew and loved.

The sermon was given by Rev. Raoul Caulkins, of Columbus, Ohio the son of a former pastor here and

long time friend of the family. He was assisted by Rev. Leroy Moore, the present pastor; and Rev. W. J. Fowler, also a former pastor here and a long time friend of the Beardsley family.

Mrs. Beardsley is still confined to the hospital and was unable to attend the services.

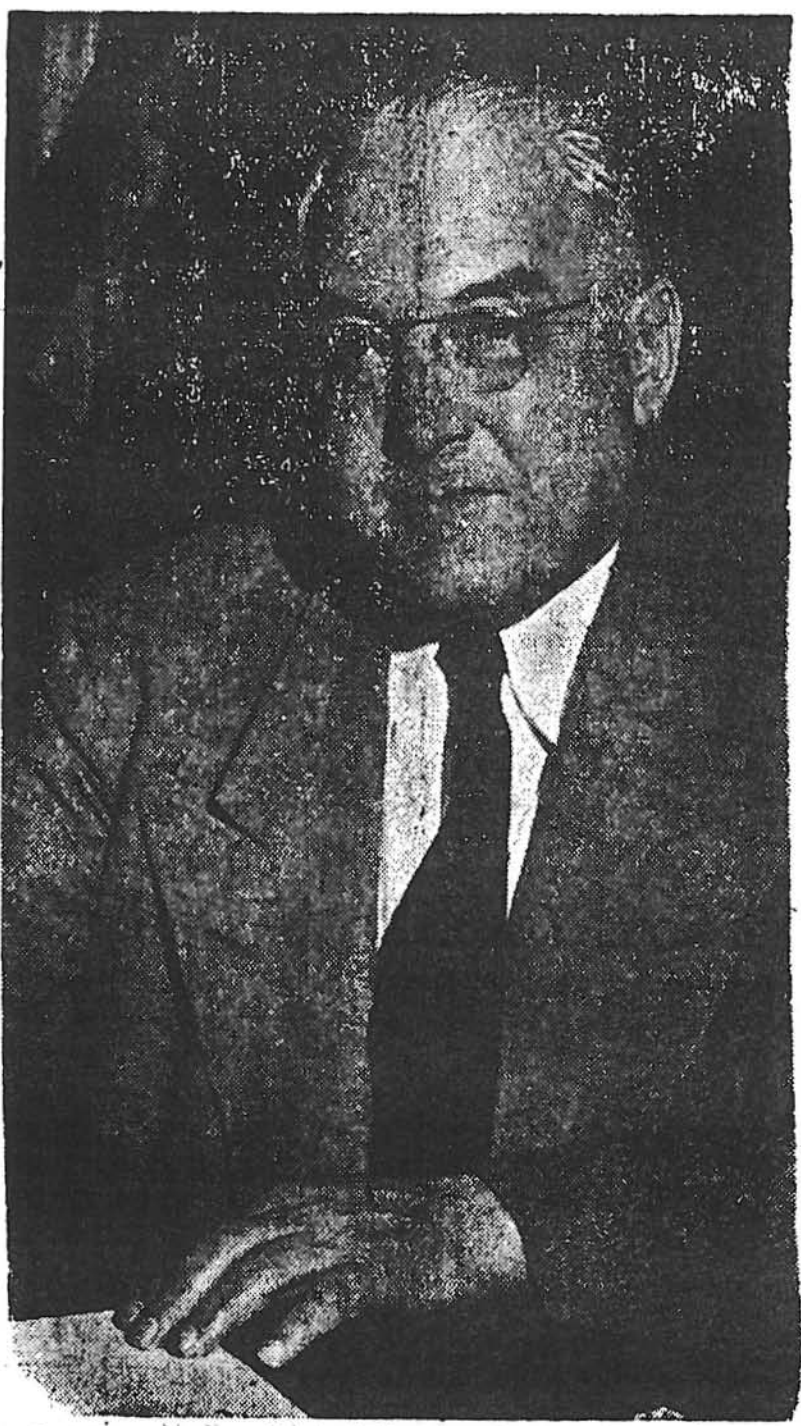

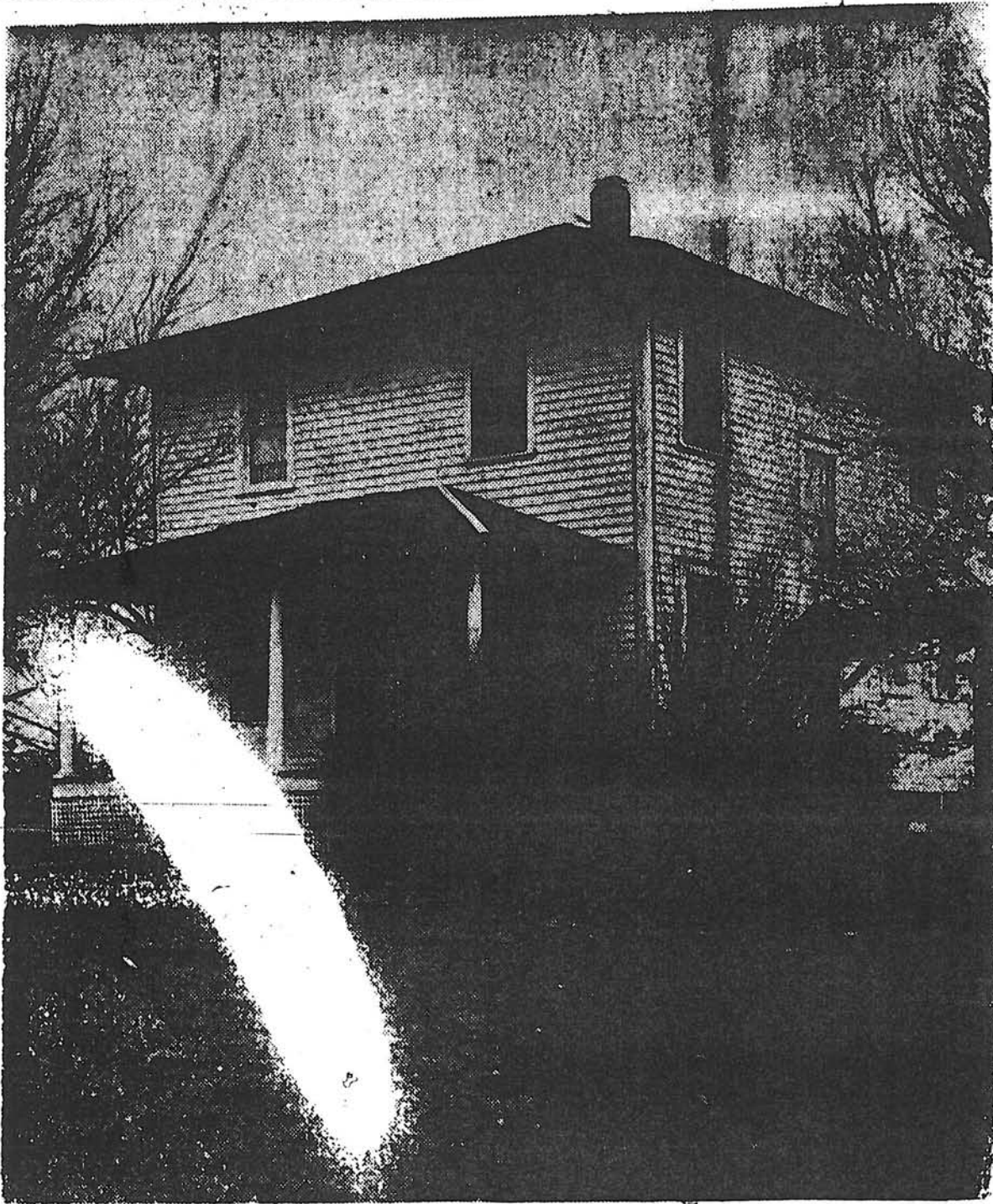
