ATLANTA, Jan. 10-(UPI)-Segregated practices at a Georgia college were ruled uncontitutional today by a federal udge who granted three Negro applicants an injunction making | it easier for them to apply at the all-white institution.

The historic decision by District Judge Boyd Sloan came almost simultaneously with another highly significant federal! decision. In that case, a federal judge in Arkansas instructed the Little Rock School Board to take "affirmative steps" on its own initiative in integrating Central High School, now closed over the race crisis.

The Arkansas judge did not order Central opened immediately but ordered the school board to report within 30 days on what! steps it had taken or planned to take to integrate the school.

Little Rock School Board Chairman Ed I. McKinley said ne had no idea what steps the board might take.

L. H. Doran, 65, Boone Attorney Dies Saturday

Lant H. Doran, 65, prominent Boone attorney, died about 5 o'clock this Saturday morning. Jan. 10, following brain surgery at the Iowa Methodist hospital in Des Moines on Dec. 29.

Mr. Doran suffered a stroke in mid-October and failed to recover from its effects which necessitated the surgery.

Born in Beaver area Mr. Doran graduated from the Drake University law school and opened practice in Boone in 1920. He was the senior member of the law firm of Doran, Doran, Doran, Erbe and Doran.

He served in the Iowa Senate from 1929 to 1931 and from 1937 to 1939. During that time he chairmaned the appropriations committee and the interim committee. He authored the Iowa school bus stop law which re- group.

To Convert Guard to P

DES MOINES, Jan. 10-(UPI) Mai. Gen. Fred C. Tandy said today he has been instructed to convert the Iowa-Nebraska National Guard's 34th Infantry to an atomic-age Pentomic division by this summer.

Tandy, Iowa's adjutant general, disclosed the timetable for the switchover in announcing the dates and sites for the Iowa National Guard's 1959 summer field training.

He said that the conversion will involve "a tremendous change of equipment" and may be difficult to accomplish by the time summer field training begins.

Tandy said the exact date for the switchover is not known as yet other than the tentative timetable calling for conversion by summer field training. He said he will announce details as soon as he receives orders from Washington.

The Pentomic division is the Army's new organization concept for fighting atomic wars. Such a division contains five battle groups instead of the current three regiments as its main fighting units. It is aimed at providing more mobility and more firepower than the existing "three-sided" division.
