Frank E. Ellis, Well Known Archeologist, Dies Dr. Andrew To Thursday At Home Here - Examine Reserves

Former State Senator Frank E. Elday evening at 5:30 o'clock following a two weeks illness. Death was due to a heart attack.

Mr. Ellis served as a democrat in the Iowa senate in 1936 and served in the 47th and .48th assemblies. He was defeated in the 1940 election by D. D. Fuller, republican.
