Stanley E. Prall, Fifth District judge for the past 20 years, died Monday evening at Iowa Metho-dist Hospital in Des Moines where he had been a pitient since Nov.

Services will be at First Methodist Church Thursday at 2 p. m. Interment will be in the Carlisle Cemetery. Memorials may be given either to First Methodist Church of to the Heart Fund.

Judge Prall was born on a farm near Carlisle, attended rural school and graduated from Car-lisle High School. He attended Simpson College and received his bachelor of laws degree from the State University of Iowa in 1928.

He was a former city solicitor and county attorney, and served two terms as representative from Warren County in the Iowa Legislature. A veteran of World War II, he served as a captain in the military government of the United States Army in Europe. He was appointed a district judge in 1946.

Judge Prall was a member of First Methodist Church, the American and Iowa Bar Associations, Indianola Lions Club, Warren Post 165, American Legion, and the Odd Fellow Lodge.



Valbracht Speaks

Any guilt merchants may have had for promoting Christmas buying immediately following and even before Thanksgiving was at least partially dispelled by the Rev. Louis Valbracht, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, Des Moines, who spoke on "Have a Good Laugh."

Critics who decry commercialism and materialism at Christmastime and call for "putting Christ back in "Christmas," he termed profits of gloom and doom."

"What do we mean, 'putting Christ back in Christmas?'" The Rev. Mr Valbracht asked. "We have taken a pagan festival, Saturnale, and made it almost tho-roughly Christian." (Feasting and the exchange of gifts at Christmas probably can be traced to Saturnale, an early Roman observance).

Christmas has become so commercialized, said the Rev. Mr Valbracht, because there is more commerce, and if there is more evidence of materialism, it probably is because there are more materials.

"Christmas is one time of the year when our commercialism and materialism is somewhat sarictified," he declared.

Laughter Missing

Laughter is the missing notethe lost chord of our day. "We, with all of our blessings, are short of joy. We have a surplus of nearly everything else except laugh-ter," the Rev. Mr Valbracht said.

"If you are contributing to community joy," he told the businessmen, "I don't care if it is through commercialism or materialism, there is nothing sinister or evil about it.

The speaker was introduced by Jim Davies, Forrest Burgin, outgoing president of the Indianola Chamber of Commerce, was master of ceremonies.



Stanley E. Prall was born February 13, 1905 on a farm near Carlisle, IA. His parents were Nathan C. and Nora (Miller) Prall. He attended Union School and Middle River Friends Church.

When his father became ill with cancer the family moved into Carlisle. He graduated from Carlisle High School in 1923. His Commencement Exercise announcement indicates he gave an oration called "Keystone of Citizenship." Next he went to Simpson

College in Indianola. In 1928 he graduated from the School of Law at the University of Iowa.

It was in the office of O. C. Brown, that he first started practicing law in Indianola. He was City Attorney of Indianola and county Attorney of Warren County for four years. He served two terms in the House of Representatives from 1937-1940.

During World War II he was a Captain in the Military Government, spending time in England, Belgium and Germany. Shortly after the war he was appointed a judge of the 5th Judicial District. He was an active, concerned and devoted judge for almost 20 years, going to the courthouse on Saturdays and accepting special assignments outside the district when asked. He kept going in spite of a heart problem that kept getting worse. It is remembered that about a week before he died, he said to the Clerk of Court, "Leave that book open, I'll be back."

On November 28, 1966, he passed away in the Methodist Hospital in Des Moines, IA. He is buried in Carlisle Cemetery next to his son, Eddie, who dies four years earlier.

He taught Sunday School in the Methodist Church. He was a member of the Red Cross, American Legion, the Odd Fellows Lodge, Lions Club, the American and State Bar Association and the Republican Party.

In 1857, Thomas Wilson Prall rode horse-back from Indiana to Van Buren Co., IA, with his father, Cornelius Nathan Prall, and his cousin, Wilson Prall. Cornelius Nathan Prall returned to Indiana to live out his life. In 1875, Thomas W. Prall moved his family to Warren Co., IA.

The first Prall immigrant to America was Arendt Jansen Van Naerden Prall (ca. 1647-1725) who was first mentioned in the old Dutch records at Kingston, NY in 1663. On June 3, 1670, Arendt Prall married Maria

Billiou, a French Huguenot, who was born in 1650 in Leyden, Holland, and they settled on a land grant on Staten Island near her folks, Peter Billiou and Francoise Dubois. Arendt's parents, his birth date, and his country of origin have not been determined, but it is believed that he was born in the Netherlands in about 1647 and came to the New Netherlands as a young man around 1660. He was a wheelwright by trade and was a tax assessor and supervisor before he died on Staten Island in 1725. Today the Staten Island Huguenot Memorial Church has one pillar dedicated to the Prall and Billiou families. and off the west side of Staten Island there is a Prall Island. Peter Billiou's house is still standing on Staten Island, and it is the oldest house on Staten Island. Presently, Staten Island has a Prall street and a Billiou street, a Prall Junion High School, and Pralls still live on Staten Island.

Captain Peter Prall (1672-1748), the oldest son of Arendt, was a captain in the militia between 1700 and 1713 and made one expedition to Canada in 1711. He was a farmer, a tax assessor in 1702, and he bought large tracts of land in New Jersey. He married Mary Christopher, Althea Garritson, and Elizabeth (last name unknown) before his death in 1748.

Peter Prall (1700-1761), the son of Capt. Peter Prall, married Sarah Grandain about 1722, and they settled in Amwell Twp., Hunterdon Co., NJ. Their farm was on the old York road that crossed the Delaware River at Coryell's ferry. Peter gave the land for the old Presbyterian church and the Pleasant Ridge Cemetery across the road from his farm. Generations of Pralls and allied families, even Revolutionary War Pralls, are buried in the cemetery.

Peter Prall (1722-1772), the son of the above Peter Prall, married about 1743 Sarah Farley. One son, John, married into the Coryell Ferry family and supposedly helped gather boats for General George Washington's crossing of the Delaware to attack Trenton during the Revolutionary War. Another son, George, is in the New Jersey Revolutionary War records. His descendants

Stanley E. Prall was born February 13, 1905 on a farm in Palmyra township, Warren County, near the Middle River Friends community. He was the son of Nathan C. Prall and Nora Miller Prall.

He attended Union country school and graduated from Carlisle High School in 1923. He attended Simpson College two years and graduated from the University of Iowa with a law degree in 1928.

On May 31, 1933 he was married to Martha K. Mitchell, and to this union a son and daughter were born.

During his law practice in Indianola, he was city attorney and county attorney. In World War II, as Captain in the Military Government, he was in several European countries, including Germany, until 1945.

In 1946 he was appointed by Governor Blue to the district court, where he served the Fifth Judicial District for twenty years.

Judge Prall was a member of the Methodist Church, the American and Iowa State Bar Associations, the Lions Club, Odd Fellows Lodge and Warren Post 165, American Legion.

He was Warren County representative in the Forty-seventh and Forty-eighth sessions of the General Assembly. He died November 28, 1966 in Des Moines.

He is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Kathleen Coe, Indianola; two grandchildren, Cindy and Mitchell; two brothers, Arthur Prall of Carlisle and Dwight Prall of Newton; and two sisters, Mrs. Luther Meloy of Sun City, Arizona, and Mrs. Carl Norlin of Kettle Falls, Washington.

His son, Edgar, was killed in an automobile accident July 12, 1962.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SIXTY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF IOWA: That in the passing of the Honorable Stanley E. 




