Emmet County Farm

The Iowa Department of
 Natural Resources has made a few
 changes in the 1991 sport fishing
 regulations. The minimum
 length has been increased to 36
 inches in all public waters.

Black bass (largemouth,
 smallmouth, spotted). A 14-inch
 minimum length limit shall apply
 to all portions of the Mississippi
 River in Iowa bordering
 Wisconsin and Illinois. The
 catch-and-release fishery on the
 Middle Raccoon River has been
 expanded downstream to the dam
 at Redfield. All black bass caught
 from the Middle Raccoon River,
 Guthrie County, extending
 downstream from below Lefnon
 Mills Dam at Panora to the dam at
 Redfield must be immediately
 released alive.

Catfish. A daily bag limit of
 15 and possession limit of 30 has
 been imposed on both the
 Missouri River and Big Sioux
 River.

Walleye. A 14-inch
 minimum size limit has been
 placed on Clear Lake, Cerro
 Gordo County, and a 15-inch
 minimum size limit is in place on
 Storm Lake, Buena Vista County.

 22 inches in length may be taken

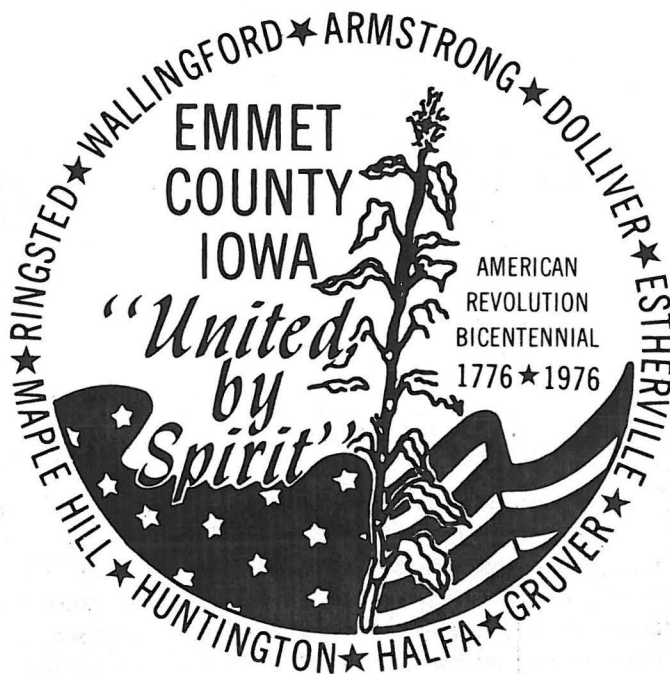

He married Grace Harter Bass who was born on February 13, 1881, to David Martin Bass and Susanna Harter Bass, on November 26, 1902, in Boone County, Iowa.

They moved to Ocheydan, Iowa, where they farmed until March 2, 1912, when they moved to Emmet County, Iowa, purchasing the SE¼ of Section 23, Township 99 North of Range 34, West of the 5th P. M., Emmet County, and this farm is now owned by his children. Mr. and Mrs. Ross farmed and raised and sold mules. One span of mules sold for \$500.00, an unheard amount in those days. They also raised horses and sold them to a dray firm in Chicago. All horses had to be over a ton before sold.

Mr. Ross was very interested in conservation and sports. The family was associated with the Farmers Union in the twenties and thirties, which held a July 4th Celebration in Riverside Park for many years.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Ross were active members in the Methodist Church during their lifetimes. They were staunch Republicans. Grace was active in League of Women Voters.

Because of the ill health of Mr. Ross, they retired to Estherville in 1924, and Mr. Ross worked as a farm laborer for several families around Estherville.

Mr. Ross died February 4, 1942, and Mrs. Ross on April 2, 1953, and they are buried in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Two children were born; Walter Belva Ross on March 10, 1913, and Esther Grace Ivadell Ross on December 1, 1916. Both were born on the above described farm.

Belva Ross is still living on the farm, where he farmed until retirement in 1973. Belva married Gertrude Andreason on March 20, 1937. They have one son, Rodney Fay Ross, who married Kathryn P. Hassel on June 5, 1965. They have six girls; Jodi Lynn, Amy Jo, Tracy Ann, Mindy Sue, Billie Jean and Marcy Dee. Rodney is employed by Sammons Communication, Inc. and owns and operates R & K Sales & Service.

Ivadell Ross is secretary-treasurer of the Estherville Abstract Company, where she has been employed since 1945.

Ralph Rousseau came in 1910 in answer to an ad in the newspaper, to work at Graaf's as an ice cream and candy maker. He had learned this trade in Paris. Ralph was born on September 11, 1888 in Paris, where he was educated in a Paris Catholic school. When he came to the states he went to school to learn the English language in Washington, D. C. He was an interpreter for the French Ambassador.

Lyda Nicholson, daughter of George and Laura Nicholson was born in Estherville December 18, 1892. She was educated in the Estherville Schools.

She clerked in Herman Oransky Department Store and the George Groves Milner Store where Paris Cleaners is now located on North Sixth Street.

Ralph and Lyda were married on April 30, 1913 in Estherville. They lived in Keokuk for awhile but returned to Estherville and worked for Henry Graaf.

Pauline, their oldest daughter was born July 23, 1914 in Keokuk. She married Gilbert Richards and they have three children, David, Paul and Paula and live in Sarasota, Florida.

Marton was born September 10, 1917 in Estherville. She married Kurt Spies of Graettinger, and they have two children, Terri and Susan. They live in Hope, North Dakota.

Bonnie was born January 2, 1920 in Estherville. She married Orin Bixby, son of Charles and Eva Bixby of Estherville. They have three children, Janine, Diana and Barbara. Orin died in 1974.

All three children were educated in Estherville High School and junior college.

Ralph purchased the Graaf Cafe (north of the Grand Theatre) in 1926 and operated it until 1935 when he was forced to discontinue his business because of the depression. He served homemade ice cream and confectionery and his products were sold all over Iowa being shipped by train. The Dutch Room in the rear was noted for many elaborate parties. The room was decorated in mahogany and mirrors, and was one of the most beautiful places between Chicago and Minneapolis. The room could serve 150 people for wedding receptions and parties, where ladies entertained their friends. There was a half a block long refrigeration fountain and boasted of a \$10,000.00 music box.

The family moved to California in 1940. Ralph died on June 1, 1963. Lyda returned to Estherville in 1974 and is a resident of the Good Samaritan Center.

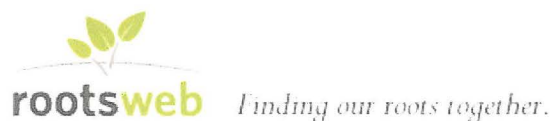
Andy had four sons and one daughter; Andrea has two sons and three daughters.
