DR. SCHADT DIES TUESDAY MORNING IN IOWA CITY

He started Practicing Medicine In Williamsburg Thirty Two Years Ago

Dr. Frederick Conrad Schadt died Tuesday forenoon in Mercy hospital in Iowa City. It was early in the morning Saturday that he suffered a paralytic stroke while in his home here. He was removed by ambulance to Iowa City where medical attention was of no avail.

So it is that death takes from our community a doctor who practiced his profession for thirty two years coming to Williamsburg in 1918 and taking the office of Dr. Shug who had passed away a short time before.

Dr. Schadt was a graduate of the college of liberal arts of the University of Iowa, a graduate of the college of pharmacy there and a graduate of the college of medicine.

He was always interested in political economy and statecraft. He was the author of treatises on economics and sociology.

From 1936 to 1940 he represented Iowa and Johnson counties in the state senate. He was for years a member of the local school board.

He maintained a deep interest in the life of the Masonic fraternity being a member of the Williamsburg lodge, a member of the Consistory in Cedar Rapids and a member of the Council at Iowa City. He was a 32nd degree mason.

He was born at Amana, Iowa, March 27, 1885, the son of Conrad and Rosalie Schadt. His preparation for the university was in the Amana schools.

His marriage with Louise Setzer of Amana took place August 22, 1918. They came to Williamsburg that year where they made their home.

They had one son, Conrad, who with his mother, survives the deceased. Dr. Schadt leaves one sister, Louise Schadt, whose home is in Williamsburg.

His funeral will be Thursday afternoon, Dec. 14 in the McSwiggan and Uhlmann funeral home. The Rev. O. B. Preston pastor of the Congregation church of which Dr. Schadt was a member will officiate. Betty Rusbult will be the soloist accompanied by Eleanor Sears at the piano.

His Masonic brethren of Stellaopolis lodge will attend in a body and at the graveside in the Amana cemetery will conduct the Masonic burial rites.

The collision of the Wallace truck and that driven by Al Kellenberger was at an intersection of county L road with the I. W. V. highway five miles east of Williamsburg. Kellenberger had two fractured ribs as a result of the meeting of the two machines.

Otto Christoph Mumm who had resided in Williamsburg for forty two years passed away Monday afternoon, Dec. 4 at his home. His health had been failing for the past two months.

He farmed for many years in Pilot township and upon retiring from the farm he moved to Williamsburg in 1908 where he followed the trade of a carpenter.

He was born in Pilot township March 1, 1875. He was the son of Peter and Anna Mumm. He received his education in Pilot township school.

His marriage to Anna Durr-Knaak took place in St. John's church near Victor January 19, 1900. He was baptized and confirmed in St. John's Lutheran church, at Victor, March 23, 1900.


After moving to Williamsburg he united with St. Paul's Lutheran church and he was a member of that church for almost forty years.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE AT WORK IN IOWA COUNTY

Conducts Survey To Find Persons Who Have Been Exposed To Tuberculosis

Miss Ruth Van Alstine, public health nurse, is conducting the contract case-finding program now in progress in Iowa county. At the request of the family physician, she has been visiting persons who may have had close contact with cases of tuberculosis, or others whom the doctor feels need to be included in the survey.

She is advising these persons to have tuberculin tests made by a physician and, if recommended a chest X-ray. The X-rays will be taken in the mobile unit provided by the State Department of Health and the Tuberculosis and Health Association.
