CEDAR FALLS — Iver H. Christoffersen, 96, of the Western Home, died there Tuesday, Sept. 5, of natural causes.

He was born Jan. 6, 1899, in Cedar Rapids, son of Hans and Mary Jensen Christoffersen. He married Veronica Sedar on Feb. 28, 1930, in Chicago.

Mr. Christoffersen was in Student Army Training Corp during World War I and served as a platoon sergeant in the State Guard during World War II.

He received his bachelor's degree from Iowa State Teachers College and had served as superintendent of schools in Marquette. He returned to school and earned his jurisprudence degree from the University of Iowa in 1926. He then became an escrow officer for Foreman State Bank in Chicago, and in the 1930s worked for Homeowners Loan Corp. He practiced law in Cedar Falls for more than 40 years and was a Cedar Falls City Attorney.

He served in the Iowa Legislature from 1936 to 1938; was 3rd District Democratic chairman for many years; was a founder and first president of the Cedar Falls Historical Society; was past president of the Cedar Falls Lions Club; was Cedar Falls Chamber of Commerce Representative Citizen of the Year in 1967; received the Sturgis Falls Cornerstone Award in 1990; and was an honorary co-chair of the fund-raising committee to restore the Regent Theatre.

Survived by: his wife; a daughter, Liane Nichols of Cedar Falls; three grandsons; five great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Marie Blake and Elsie Parrott Wilcox, both of Cedar Falls.

Preceded in death by: a sister, Gertrude Showers.
