EMERSON -- Services for William H. Cramer, former Iowa legislator and real estate and insurance agent here for many years, will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday, March 29, at the First Baptist church here. He died Saturday, March 26 in Murphy Memorial hospital following a stroke. Burial will be in Emerson cemetery.

Born in Illinois, Mr. Cramer came to Iowa when he was a young man. He married Elizabeth Reynolds and four years ago the couple observed their 50th wedding anniversary.

He served in the Iowa house of representatives from 1933-1935 and was active in Humanity Lodge and the First Baptist church here.

He was a farmer and auctioneer until he retired and moved to Emerson where he was in the real estate and insurance business.

Surviving are his wife; a son, Earl of Griswold; a daughter, Mrs. Gayle Greenwood of Emerson; eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

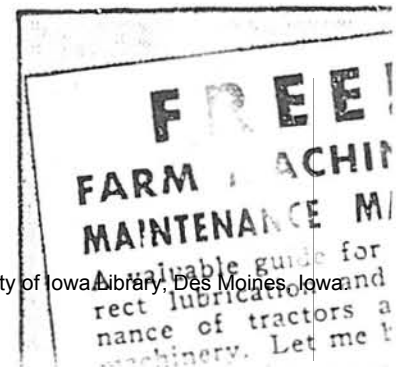
