He is a widower and has one married daughter.

Whited, who will assume his new duties about Dec. 1, succeeds Everett Phillips.

# Set funeral service for William Dreessen

Funeral services are set for 2 p. m. Friday at the First Presbyterian Church for 74-year-old William J. "Bill" Dreessen, chairman of the Crawford County Board of Supervisors, who was fatally stricken Tuesday morning in a downtown Denison cafe.

Mr. Dreessen was concluding his third term as a supervisor. He had planned to retire at the end of this term.

Mr. Dreessen was widely known in Iowa political circles, having been a member of the Iowa legislature for three regular terms and two special sessions. He was a former county assessor.

Mr. Dreessen was born in Crawford County Aug. 19, 1889, the son of Herman and Margaret Dreessen. He was educated in rural schools and lived in the county nearly all his life, farming about four miles east and a half mile north of Boyer.

He is survived by his wife, Wilhelmina, 1122 Fifth Avenue North, Denison; three sons,
