CHICAGO AND NEW YORK 1931 tor McCulloch through all the years of his professional work has been interested in land and agriculture, and his farm, two miles southwest of Humeston, has afforded an opportunity for his son, a scientific agriculturist, to work out his plans. It is one of the model farms of Wayne County.

Dr. George McCulloch grew up in Holmes County, Ohio, attended school at Millersburg and Haysville, and when a young man came out to Iowa, partly because of his father's landed investments here. While at Brooklyn he worked in a drug store and began the study of medicine with E. Rayburn. In the fall of 1871 he entered Rush Medical College of Chicago, and was graduated from that institution in 1873. Doctor McCulloch was in Chicago at the time of the great fire which started in October, 1871.

With his medical diploma he returned to Iowa and in the same year began his professional career at Humeston. For many years he had a large practice that taxed his full strength and energy to attend to it. Along with his medical practice he has been interested in business and public affairs. Including the land originally acquired by his father he owns about 1,700 acres of Iowa farming land. In business he has always pen conservative, and he takes considerable ride in the fact that he never signed a mortgage for all his extensive land ownership. Since 1880 he has been engaged in banking at Humeston and is now president of the Citizens State Bank of that town. He is local surgeon for the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railway.

Doctor McCulloch has for many years been a leader in the Republican organization of his county. He has been a member of the Humeston City Council and for several terms was a faithful legislator. He was a member of the House of Representatives in the Nineteenth Assembly, this being the last session held in the old capitol building in 1882. A number of years later he was elected to the House, serving in the Thirtieth and Thirty-first sessions, and was a member of the State Senate in the Thirty-third and Thirty-fourth Assemblies. Doctor McCulloch has for fifty-seven years been a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and his Masonic membership covers a period of fortyeight years. His many interests and activities have probably done much to prolong his life and keep his interests keen, so that at the age of eighty-one he is younger in attitude than many men a score of years his junior.

Doctor McCulloch married in 1880 Miss

Doctor McCulloch married in 1880 Miss Druscilla Maxwell, of Holmes County, Ohio. She died at Humeston in March, 1929, when they had been married nearly half a century.

Dector McCulloch's son, Milan E. McCulloch, is an Iowa authority on agricultural science. He graduated from the Iowa State College at Ames, and is also a graduate of the Chicago Law School. He has won numerous honors in agriculture, particularly as a soil specialist, and has served as soil inspector of Iowa.

ROY E. STEVENS. Wapello County has been the home of the Stevens family through four generations. They were a pioneer family, and their contributions to the welfare and progress of this section of Iowa have been numerous and important. For many years one of the largest establishments handling shoes in Southern Iowa has been owned and controlled by members of the Stevens family, the present proprietor being Roy E. Stevens, whose name is familiarly associated with well directed efforts and influence as a broad minded citizen.

It was in the late 1840s that the Stevens family arrived in Wapello County, having made the journey from the East in a prairie schooner. The oldest member of the family at that time was Jacob Stevens, who came accompanying his son, Dr. Abraham V. Stevens. Doctor Stevens was born in 1815, and was a fine type of the old-time country doctor. He practiced medicine in Wapello County for over forty years, doing that work before the advent of good roads, telephones or other improvements that have so much lightened the burdens of country medical practice. On coming to Iowa Doctor Stevens entered a tract of Government land. This land has been in the family ownership ever since and is now occupied by his son, Orlando C. Stevens, who lives at his country home near Highland Center. Crlando C. Stevens was for many years engaged in business as a shoe merchant at Ottumwa, continuing until 1902. He married Ella Buckner. Orlando Stevens was the youngest of a family of fourteen children born to his mother, Catherine (Peckenpaugh) Miller Stevens.

Roy E. Stevens, son of Orlando C. and Ella (Buckner) Stevens, was born in Wapello County in 1878. After the local schools he attended the John O'Bryan Business College in Ottumwa. From boyhood he had a round of duties in his father's business, and when his father retired in 1902 the son bought the business and for over a quarter of a century has continued it, with expansion of its facilities and service so that it is now one of the largest concerns of its kind in Southern Iowa, employing fifteen sales people. Another store is conducted at Oskaloosa, with a force of five sales people. Mr. Stevens was one of the organizers of the Iowa Retail Shoe Association, serving twice as its president, and for nine years has been a director for Iowa in the Notional Shoe Retailers of America.

Mr. Stevens has a broad conception of his civic responsibilities. He was one of the first promoters of hard surfaced roads for Wapello Ccunty and Southern Iowa. For the past six years he has been chairman of the good roads committee of Wapello County and a member of of the executive committee of the Iowa State Good Roads Association. Much of his thought and effort are directed toward the betterment and improvement of country life conditions. He owns and operates several farms, has closely studied agricultural conditions, and in general is always willing to lend his support and coopera-

tion to any movement for higher standards in his home locality and state. He is a member of the Lodge, Royal Arch Chapter and Malta Commandery of Knights Templar Masons at Ottumwa, the Scottish Rite Consistory at Des Moines, is a member of the B. P. O. Elks, charter member of the Rotary Club, belongs to the Chamber of Commerce and Ottumwa Retailers Association, the Country Club and Wapello Club. He and his family for many years have been active in the First Presbyterian Church of Ottumwa.

Mr. Stevens married in 1907 Miss Marie Van De Ven. She was born in the old Holland community of Pella, Iowa, is a graduate of the Ottumwa High School and taught school at Ottumwa before her marriage. They have one daughter, Martha Marie, attending school at Ottumwa.

Spencer H. Amos was one of the veteran and honored members of the bar of Decatur County at the time of his death, which occurred June 22, 1923. Here he had been continuously established in the practice of his profession at Garden Grove during a period of nearly half a century, and he not only achieved success and prestige in his profession but was also known and valued as a sterling citizen of marked loyalty and public

spirit.

Mr. Amos was born in Ohio, February 2, 1850. and thus was seventy-three years of age at the time of his death. He was a son of William and Elizabeth (Bramble) Amos, and was a child when the family came to Iowa and established residence on a farm in Wayne County, his parents having passed the remainder of their lives in this state. Mr. Amos received the advantages of the Iowa public schools and also those of higher educational institutions of this state. He gave effective service a number of years as a teacher in the public schools, and in the mean-while he initiated the study of law. He made rapid advancement in the absorption and assimilation of the science of jurisprudence, was in due course admitted to the Iowa bar, and from 1877 until his death he was engaged in the practice of law at Garden Grove, where he long controlled a substantial and representative law business that indicated popular appreciation of his professional ability and also his secure place in the confidence and esteem of the community. He was for many years a director and the attorney for the Garden Grove Bank, and for a time was editor and publisher of the Garden Grove Express. Mr. Amos was a stalwart and well fortified advocate and supporter of the cause of the Republican party, was an earnest member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, as is also his widow, and was influential in the Iowa circles of the Masonic fraternity, in which he was a Knight Templar and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine. He was one of the old and honored members of the Decatur County Bar Association at the time of his death, and held membership also in the Iowa State Bar Association.

In Decatur County was solemnized the marriage of Mr. Amos to Miss Josephine Amos, who was born in Virginia, she having been a child when her parents, Albert and Caroline Amos, established their home in Iowa. Mrs. Amos received excellent educational advantages and prior to her marriage she had been a successful and popular teacher in the public schools of Iowa, Montana and Kansas. She was one of the organizers and charter members of the Garden Grove chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star and served as its first worthy matron. She has continued influential in this branch of the Masonic fraternity and now resides in the Iowa Eastern Star Home at Boone. She has long been a gracious figure in church, cultural and social affairs in the Hawkeye State, and in her old home community at Garden Grove her circle of friends is limited only by that of her acquaintance. Florence, first born of the children of Mr. and Mrs. Amos, died in childhood. Daisy, the second child, is the wife of Robert O. Bennett, of Garden Grove, and they have four children: Mrs. Amy Rushing, of Rockford, Iowa; Miss Greta E., a popular teacher in the Marcus, Iowa, public schools; Lucille, a graduate nurse who is doing admirable service in her profession; and Roberta O., who remains at the parental home. The third daughter, Mrs. Nan E. Raleigh, resides in the City of Seattle, Washington, and she has one child, Eva G.

JOSEPH LAWRENCE HARMAN was a resident of Ottumwa for over forty years. That community came to know and respect his business judgment, his helpful spirit in all civic matters, and his earnestness and probity in all the varied rela-


tionships of life.

Mr. Harman was born in Highland County, Ohio, July 21, 1840, a son of David and Esther (Lawrence) Harman. David Lawrence was a native of the Shenandoah Valley, Virginia, and after living in Ohio for many years come out to Iowa and spent his last years in Wapello County. Joe L. Harman was reared and educated in his native state, and joined an Ohio regiment for service in the Civil war. He was a brave and dutiful soldier until the end, coming out with the rank of first lieutenant.

Shortly after the war closed he came west and settled at Ottumwa and engaged in the insurance business. He was well educated, had a superior knowledge of accountancy, and he brought his skill and judgment to an increasingly successful business career. Mr. Harman passed away De-

cember 16, 1907.

He married, September 10, 1867, Miss Maggie Zollars, who survives him and resides in Ottumwa. Mrs. Harman was born in Carroll County, Ohio, January 17, 1846, daughter of Daniel and Mary Ann (Druckemiller) Zollars. Her father was a native of Pennsylvania, lived in Ohio, for some years and in 1854 came out to Iowa and settled on a farm on the outskirts of Ottumwa in Wapello County. He afterwards accumulated a large body of land, and even-
