

Pat's Dance, Spring Clean-Up Week, 8th Annual Salesmen's Day, Ridiculous Day, Moonlight Madness and Shop Christmas in Hartley. One new addition to Ridiculous Day was a Chamber fund-raising Slave Auction. Chamber members volunteered to work one day for the highest bidder; thirty-three members participated raising over \$2000.

Efforts to form a JayCees organization (formerly known as Junior Chamber of Commerce) succeeded for a short time in 1975. However the group disbanded and has not been able to re-establish itself.

The newest organization initiated by the Chamber of Commerce is the Goodwill Ambassadors. These Chamber members are considered an arm of the Chamber promoting goodwill and welcoming new business to Hartley.

Records show that in 1978 there were 105 active members and Lifetime members participating in the Hartley Chamber of Commerce.

Farmers Mutual Insurance Association of O'Brien County

The Farmers Mutual Insurance Association of O'Brien County, Iowa, was organized in the spring of 1890 through the conscientious efforts of a group of public-spirited men in canvassing the county to procure one hundred thousand dollars insurance on property in O'Brien County, the requirement necessary in order to obtain the charter.

Most of the credit for signing up the required amount in order to obtain the charter should go to J. P. Martin, Sutherland, Iowa, a Civil War Veteran, who served as the first President, and incidentally lived to be one hundred two years old, the last Civil War Veteran in Iowa at the time of his death on September 20, 1949.

Mr. Martin traveled on horseback, on foot and by one horse sleigh all through the winter when finally on March 11, 1890 Articles of Incorporation were approved, with the following officers: J. P. Martin, President; S. B. Crosser, Vice President; L. T. Gates, Secretary; and H. P. Scott, Treasurer.

The first million dollars in risks was not obtained until 1900 and through the untiring efforts of the Officers, Directors, and Agents, the Association continued to make a rapid growth. By continued inspection and risk prevention, the Association has been able to maintain the needed surplus without any substantial rate increases.

In 1923 the Home Office of the Association was moved from Sanborn to Hartley, Iowa. William Treimer of our city was elected Secretary, the position he served until the time of his death on April 6, 1957. The Farmers Mutual Insurance Association, also known as the O'Brien County Mutual Insurance Association, continued to maintain its position as a progressive Company, and it was on March 7, 1941 the Association purchased six fire trucks to be placed in the various towns of O'Brien County, to be manned by

volunteer firemen of each town. This number was gradually expanded to eleven fire fighting units, with placement in all towns of the County, as well as one unit to serve the Granville area of Sioux County. It was through such a plan as this, the rural people of this area were not taxed for fire protection, and it was the foresight of the Directors that the fire trucks would pay for themselves in the buildings that would be saved as a result of the ownership. It has been said that this Insurance Association was the only Insurance Association in the United States, that provided this number of fire trucks to a community in the interest of fire safety, which was also a move to maintain low cost insurance for its policyholders.

Similar to a good many other County Mutuals, the soundness and integrity of the Directors and Officers and their continuous service with very small remuneration for their services during the pioneer days, were the fundamental reasons for the successful operation of the O'Brien County Mutual. . . during eighty-nine years in service, only five Secretaries and seven Presidents served this organization.

Tribute should be paid to certain Directors and Officers who have served in the past, but are now deceased. Among this group, the County Mutual includes Wm. Appeldorn, Sr., Paullina, Iowa; Warren Norton of Sanborn; Orren Tjossem of Gaza; and R. L. Simm of Paullina; Wm. Treimer of Hartley; George H. Kaiser of Primghar; Orlo H. Smith of Paullina; John Watterson of Sutherland; P. L. Youngers of Sheldon; Anton Baadte of Sheldon; G. W. Smith of Paullina and Fred Nelson of Sheldon. And there are others, having passed on, but contributing much to the success of the County Mutual.

Now the Farmers Mutual Insurance Association holds the enviable record of being one of the largest County Mutual Insurance Associations in the State of Iowa, with over two hundred million of risks in force and a reserve for claim payments of over one million five hundred thousand dollars.

Current Directors and Officers now serving this County Mutual are President Walter Kruse of Sheldon; Vice President Harold Klink of Spirit Lake; Secretary-Treasurer Virgil Treimer of Hartley; Assistant Secretary-Treasurer Duane Kolpin of Hartley and Office Manager Gloria Riedemann of Hartley. Other directors serving are Bernard Watterson, Sutherland; Wm. Appeldorn, Paullina; Raymond Youngers, Sheldon; Wallace Simm, Paullina; Ronald Vander Sluis, Primghar; and David Norton, Sanborn. Sterling Archer, former Treasurer, serves in position of Director Emeritus. Risk management position is held by Harry Kaiser with George Sleeper as Claims Supervisor.

In 1973 the Association built its first Home Office Building located at 91 S. Central Avenue, Hartley, Iowa, and plans are soon to be underway to celebrate its 100th Anniversary scheduled for March of 1990.

Sam Swift was born in Benton, Wisconsin, in 1876, and passed away July 19, 1952, at the age of 76 years.

Ira L. Turner was born at Oakland, Iowa, October 18, 1882, and passed away at Malvern, Iowa, May 27, 1957.


