12. Other applicable information Grandfather William was ståemboat engineer on Ohio River; moved to Agency, Ia in 1849 and was engineer for mill there 35 yrs. His father and sib lings followed him to Agency but siblings moved on to Mo & Oregon. He married Harriet Hutson Price in Agbmay in 1853. 5 ch. Fatehr Charles C Sr. both lawyer & registered pharmacist, moved to Ottumwa after marrige & practriced law there until 1911 when the fam moved to Chicago area.

His older brother, Harold Fullen Ayres, b. 1901, was child prodigy violinist, giving concerts at age 5. Family move to Chicatgowas to further Harold's musical education. Harold was concertmaster of Minneaplis Cymphony 15 yrs, and later of orchestras in Calif. Also noted teacher of violin.

Charles Jr. returned to Ottumwa in 1929, and read law. Admitted to bar in 1932 and practiced for 32 yrs before becoming judge.

Was avid volleyball player for over 51 yrs. Played in tournaments throughout Midwest & in Calif. Was on Y teams from Ottumwa that won 6 state volleyball torunaments. Also coached teams.

Was best known ornithologist in Iowa. Gve hundereds of bird talks to various groups. Recived "Centennial Awrd" from Iowa Academy of Science for birding activities. Estimated he had banded over 70,000 birds, includingonly chuck-wills widow bqanded in Iowa. Founded Ottumwa Bird Club in 1943 and was its president until 1987; also founded outdoor film series of club c. 1975. In highschool he led his zoology class by finding 153 species of birds.
