Plan Budget Amendment

An amendment to the current budget for the Indianola Community School District, as approved by the board of education, is being published in this issue of The Record-Herald and Indianola Tribune.

The amended budget increases expenditures in the general fund from \$635,230 as provided for in the budget adopted Aug. 5, 1959, to \$727,812.

However, there will be no increase in taxes due to the budget amendment, as the additional funds came from reorganized rural districts.

There were three major expenditures from these additional funds:

Where existing rural districts were divided between other reorganized districts, settlements amounting to \$20,797.33 had to be made.

While it was originally planned to pay for five new school busses, purchased at the beginning of the current school year, over a 5-year period, the board of directors decided to pay for the busses in full, requiring an additional \$20,853.34.

Additions to the revolving fund were necessary to purchase new books for pupils coming in from the rural areas.

A public hearing on the amended budget will be held at the superintendent's office at 8 p.m. on June 1.

Victor Felter Dies After Brief Illness

Victor Felter, 83, former state representative, died Sunday night at Chambers Nursing Home where he had been taken Tuesday, May 10, following a stroke.

Funeral services will be held at First Methodist church here Wednesday at 2 p.m. Interment will be in I. O. O. F. cemetery.

Following their marriage in 1904 Mr and Mrs Felter lived on a farm near Washita. Later they bought a farm near Cherokee. For eight years prior to moving to a farm north of Indianola, he had served as county agent of Cherokee county.

In 1928 he purchased 82 acres 3 miles north of Indianola and set out a large commercial orchard which he operated until 1951. Mr and Mrs Felter moved to Indianola in October, 1957.

In Legislature

He was elected president of the Warren County Farm Bureau in 1930, but resigned to become a candidate for state representative. He was elected in 1930, 1932 and 1934, serving in the sessions of 1931, 1933, 1935 and the extra session of 1936.

For 50 years he was connected with the Iowa State Fair either as an exhibitor, judge or superintendent of the agriculture building.

In 1915 he was in charge of the famous "Horn of Plenty" feature in the Iowa agriculture exhibit at the Pan American Exposition at San Francisco, Calif.

He was a school director for 27 consecutive years.

Mr Felter has been president of the Warren County Agriculture Association, Iowa Horticulture Association, Iowa Fruit Growers Association, Iowa Fair Managers Association, Iowa Bee Keepers Association and the Indianola Garden Club.

In 1953 he was presented the Iowa Horticulture Association's Gold Merit award.

Mr and Mrs Felter celebrated their Golden Wedding anniversary June 8, 1954.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs Harold Hopkins of St. Cloud, Minn., and Mrs Marvin Cone of Moscow, Idaho; two sons, Victor Jr. of Mksoula, Mont., and Donald of Cainville, Mo.; and 12 grandchil-
