Former Essex Native Dies

An Essex native and well known figure in Iowa politics, Homer H. Hush, 87, Des Moines, died Friday at Rochester Minn., of cancer.

Services will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday from the Westover Funeral Home, Des Moines, with burial at 2 p.m. at Evergreen Cemetery, Red Oak.

Hush attended Simpson College, was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives as a Republican in 1928 and to the Senate in 1930. In 1936, Mr. Hush changed party affiliation and, as a Democrat, headed the "Iowa Farmers Committee for the Reelection of President Franklin Roosevelt." He served as assistant state secretary of agriculture under Gov. Nelson Kraschel.

Hush was also associate editor of Wallace's Farmer from 1942 to his retirement 20 years ago.

Survivors include three sons, Howard of Detroit, Mich.; Clarence of Emporia, Kan.; and Merle of Minneapolis, Minn.; a brother, Paul Hush of Cincinnati, Ohio; five grandchildren and six greatgrandchildren.


