**C. E. Malone Dies Of Heart Attack**

ATLANTIC, IA.—Funeral arrangements were being made here for C. E. Malone, 63, postmaster and former member of the Iowa legislature, who died Thursday after suffering a heart attack while working in his yard.

He was a state representative for five years before being elected to the state senate in 1935. He was a frequent exhibitor at the state fair and for several years had charge of the county competitions there in grains and vegetables. He was assistant superintendent of the Iowa exhibit at the St. Louis, Mo., world fair.

Mr. Malone had lived here all of his life, and served six years on the Cass county board of supervisor and as county treasurer in 1914-18.

Surviving are his wife and two sons, Claude and Cecil, both in the seed business here.

**Begin Trial for \$500 Against Yellow Cab**
