

About when the city ball park was built, and the way baseball became a matter of town identity and pride in the late '30s.

"He was very proud of that ball park. He served on the fair board when they got rid of the old fairgrounds, and they gave the city the park. Then when he was mayor he got the WPA to build the pavilion there. He was awfully proud of that," Tom recalled.

When Frank passed away he was 98 years old. He had led a long and fruitful life, and even in his final years he was a noted figure. He will be remembered for the way he faithfully kept office hours at the law office well into his 90s. He will be remembered for his impeccable manners and the way he still tipped his hat to ladies on the street.
