Building Plan, Wage Increase, Told By Fisher

Wage increases of seven cents an hour for about 800 factory and office workers employed on an hourly basis were announced Monday by the Fisher-Governor company, and at the same time the company disclosed it will build an addition to its factory.

J. W. (Bill) Fisher, executive vice president, said the new building will occupy a fourth of a block immediately west of the present plant. It will add 40,000 square feet of floor space, giving the factory a total of 162,000 square feet.

PARTY FOR WORKERS

The wage increase and plans for the addition first were revealed to the company's employes at a party Saturday night in the coliseum.

Construction is scheduled to get under way about Oct. 15 on the addition to the plant. A contract for the building was awarded to Arthur H. Neumann and Brothers, Inc., engineers and contractors, of Des Moines.

The new, one-story building will be of steel and faced brick, monitor type construction with 14 foot minimum clearance thruout.

WALLS OF WINDOWS

Continuous window design on walls and monitors will provide excellent light and ventilation. Floors will be wood blocks over concrete. It will house all production machinery, the tool crib, and related equipment now in various sections of the present plant.

In other words, the departments comprising the machine shop, brass room, engine lathes, milling machines, and valve fitters, as well as the other production machinery will all be moved into the new building. Some additional machinery will be installed. The new setup will provide more space for the machines than is devoted to that equipment in the present plant.

MORE OFFICE SPACE

This arrangement will allow additional area for the rough stock, finished stock, and assembly and shipping, as well as more office space. Plans for the ultimate shifting of these departments are indefinite, but it is likely that the second floor area immediately below the general office will be used for additional office space.

The new building will occupy the entire quarter block west of the present plant, bordered by Center and Linn streets. The addition is scheduled for completion April.

The house and the filling station occupying the new plant area are being removed, and employes are asked not to park their cars in that quarter block in order not to interfere with this preliminary work, Fisher said.

Don V. McLean Is Dead At 67 In Home Here

Donald V. McLean, 67, a republican member of the Iowa house of representatives from 1933 to 1937, died at his home, 301 South Ninth street, Sunday at 9:30 a.m. He had been in failing health for three years and seriously ill since last spring. Death was of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Born in Marshall county July 7, 1880, he was the son of Henry C. McLean and Emma Jane Roundy. He was educated at Marshalltown high school and at Iowa State college at Ames. He was married to Anna M. Packer Dec. 27, 1906, at the Packer home on the West Main street road.

A farmer near here many years, Mr. McLean was widely known as a stockman, raising purebred Hereford cattle. The family moved to Marshalltown in 1943.

AN INSURANCE ORGANIZER

Mr. McLean helped organize the Iowa Farm Mutual Insurance company in the state and in Marshall county. He was general agent here until 1946.

A charter member of the Marshall County Farm bureau, Mr. McLean was a past president and past director of that organization. At the time of his death he was president of the Lamolille Cemetery association. He was president of the Iowa Taxpayers association at the time of his death and was a past president and past secretary of the Marshall County Taxpayers association. He was president of the Central Iowa Fair association six years.

A member of the Lamolille Community church, Mr. McLean was chairman of the board of trustees, a position he had held many years.

The Marshall county native was a former master of Damascus lodge No. 264, A.F. & A. M., at Albion, past patron of Cleo chapter No. 303, O.E.S., of State Center. He was also a past president of the Lions club.

OPERATED GOLF COURSE

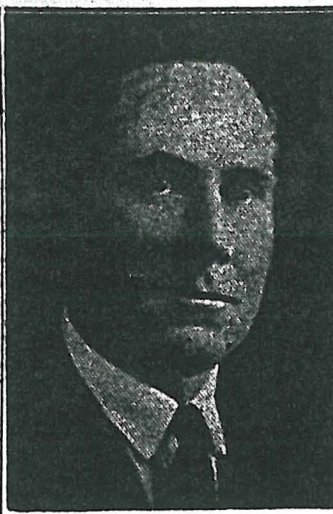
Mr. McLean laid out the first miniature golf course in Iowa in 1930 across from his home and operated it many years. It is now known as Orchard park.

Memorial to the Honorable William Kruse of Floyd County

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable William Kruse, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

William Kruse was born in Union County, Iowa, January 23, 1890, and passed away August 22, 1950, at his farm home near Charles City, Iowa. He was educated in the Jasper County schools and moved to Floyd County in 1914 where he was a successful farmer and public spirited citizen. He was married and the father of three sons, all of whom are outstanding men in the community. Mr. Kruse was active in the Methodist Church, Farm Bureau, Lions Club, several lodges and other civic organizations.

His outstanding public service was as Representative from Floyd County where he served with distinction in the Forty-eighth, Forty-ninth, Fiftieth, Fiftieth Extra, Fifty-first, Fifty-second, Fifty-second Extra and Fifty-third General Assemblies. He was elected Speaker pro tempore in the Fifty-third General Assembly. When his name was placed in nomination for this office of responsibility and trust, the following compliment was given him: "He is fair, honest and reliable, and we know he will serve with honor and dignity."

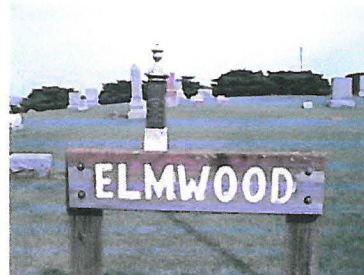
