Harley H. Sorg, a retired Hawkeye and Tripoli pharmacist, passed away at 9:55 a. m. Thursday, Feb. 27, at his home at 1204 Washington dr. following an extended ill-

He was born December 26, 1882 at Sumner, the son of Fred H. and Sarah Burhart Sorg. Mr. Sorg was graduated from the Hawkeye high school and the Highland Park College of Pharmacy in Des Moines. He was married August 4; 1908 at Hawkeye to Miss Clara B. Bopp who survives. For more than 50 years Mr. Sorg owned pharmacies in Hawkeye and Tripoli, retiring seven years ago and moving to Marion where he was associated with his son in the drug business. He was always active in civic affairs in both Hawkeye and Tripoli and in 1933 and '34 he served in the Iowa State legislature. He was a member of the Marion Methodist church.

Mr. Sorg was a member of the Iowa Pharmaceutical association; Lookout Lodge No. 395, A. F. & A. M. of Sumner, and Iowa Consistory in Cedar Rapids.



#### DRAY

An essential business of the horse and wagon days was the drayline. Trucks serve the purpose today. Goods needed to be hauled from the train to businesses and produce such as butter moved to the railroad cars.

George Ward, Charles Pitts, Warren Hand, Robert A. Smith, Otho Lee, Robert Chicken, Ray Wilson, Frank Hilson, Art Ortman and Mr. Lewis were draymen. In 1930-31 H. H. Engel sold his drayline to Alfred Foot. Engel had begun using a truck in 1927.

By 1934 the Town Council was paying for trucking rather than draying.

1 CE

James Lee and Son (Otho) started the ice business in 1907 and sold to Heine Engel in 1930. They built a cement dam on the creek on what is now Remy's creek between the track and the road. The cement block still snows. When the ice was frozen thick enough to hold a team it would be marked in squares, plowed to separate the blocks and loosened. It was loaded on sleds and stored in the ice house near the Lee home on West Cumming street.

During the summer the ice was delivered to homes and businesses on a schedule.

#### DRUGGIST

Such items as Rocky Mountain Tea; Sassafras Tea; Lydia Pinkham's Tonic; Dr. Tomlinson's Celebrated H.H.H. Liniment; Gum Camphor and Lane's Tea, as advertised as a family medicine; a remedy for many ailments; Boone's Emerald Oil, a powerful penetrating healing oil; and many other such items were found on the druggist's shelves.

Little has been recorded in the early history of Hawkeye, regarding the sale of drugs. The names of Charles Dewey and John Becker as well as Vernon Webb are mentioned before 1895.

D. Jerome Walker was here to vote on the question of incorporation and so was L. A. Fisher, who served on the first council and was the second mayor before moving to a drug store in West Union. Foot and H.R. Adams were here along with A.H. Brooks. "Bert"Brooks operated a drug store, as well as a jewelry business in the front of his building. In the rear end was the town post office when he was the post master. The Brooks family later moved to Independence.

C.F. McLaughlin was in the building which is now owned by Arnold Pleggenkuhle. The drug store was in the building which is now used for storage. McLaughlin soon moved elsewhere. A.C. Burkhart was his successor. Burkhart enlarged his drug stock by carrying a line of wall paper, paint, and other items.

In the meantime H.H. Sorg, just fresh from college, started a second drug store in Hawkeye, which was located in the west portion of what is now the Boie Hardware Store. Sorg soon took Earl Burkhart, a pharmacy graduate from Ames, as his partner. The firm was known as the "Sorg and Burkhart" Drug Store.

It was in June, 1911, that Henry F. Hauth bought the drug store owned and operated by A.C. Burkhart. Burkhart and his family moved to Independence, where he became a Ford salesman for C.W. Bopp. Burkhart remained in this business until his retirement.

Henry Hauth operated the drug store he had purchased from Burkhart until his younger brother, Louis, had finished college and had returned from service in World War I. It was in 1920 that Louis joined his brother, in a partnership business, known as "Hauth Bros. Drug Store".

It was in 1927, that Sorg and Burkhart dissolved partnership. Sorg, learning of the need of a pharmacist and drug store opening in Tripoli, moved to that town, where he remained in business for many years. Later the family moved to Marion, Iowa, where his son, Fritz Sorg, now owns and operates the "Sorg Pharmacy". Fritz Sorg, a native son of Hawkeye, is now serving his second term as State Representative in the Iowa legislature.

The Earl Burkhart family moved to Guttenberg, Iowa, where he purchased a pharmacy and operated it until his sudden death in 1929.

It was in 1927 that "Hauth Bros." moved to the location, formerly occupied by Sorg and Burkhart and remained in that location until 1949, when a new building on west Main Street, owned by Ben Heinmiller, was made available (Lot 14, Block 4). "Hauth Bros." drug store remained in that building until the store closed in 1967. This business prospered for more than forty years, always taking an active part in the town's progress and activities. Henry retired in 1959, and Louis continued with the business, until his death on January 7, 1963.

For five years Mrs. Hauth managed the drug store with the assistance of her son John, a pharmacist at New Hampton, and Mrs. Zerilda Richardson, a registered pharmacist, on duty full time. Mrs. Rosie

Burkhart worked as a full time clerk. In the spring of 1967, the store closed due to the ill health of the pharmacist, Mrs. Richardson.

In the spring of 1948, the sons of Henry and Louis Hauth, Henry, Jr., and John H., both pharmacists and native sons of Hawkeye, formed a partnership business in New Hampton, known as the "Hauth Corner Drug." Henry, jr. died suddenly of a heart attack in 1960. John now owns and operates the pharmacy. In 1965 he was named New Hampton's "Boss of the Year" and in 1968, received an award, the A. H. Robins "Bowl of Hygeia", for outstanding community service. This award was given by the Iowa Pharmaceutical Association.

#### GENERAL MERCHANDISE

This all-purpose type of store has lost to the specialists in today's world. However it more economically served the fewer needs of the customers in the 1800's and until the 1930's. Tonne was the last.

Coons and Ferrill had the first general merchandise store south of the tracks where the lumberyard is now. H.R. Palmer started in a small way in 1886 to build up a business. He joined others who had faith in the future of Hawkeye to build the Merchants Opera House in 1894. Most of the time he owned the controlling interest and eventually gained sole ownership. He conducted his general merchandise business in what is now the Boie Hardware and Electric hardware section.

Belschner and Spitzbart operated a general store where Parker's Grocery is now (lot eighteen, block five). It had a balcony in which shoes and rubber footwear were sold. Children enjoyed looking down on people on the main floor.

Henry Parker was operating the store when it burned partially. He built up the inside and sold to Frank Lee. Lee sold to Leo Johnston who specialized in groceries.

Nate Jacobs had a general store in 1899. He and his son, Harry, built the "Doublestore" in block four after the 1899 fire. In all, the Jacobs sold general merchandise for about thirty years in Hawkeye. Nate was there to vote on the incorporation question and Harry left because of poor health, in 1923.






