A longtime Mapleton attorney and brigadier general (ret.) of the Iowa National Guard, Oliver P. Bennett Sr., 81, died unexpectedly Friday of an apparent heart attack in Des Moines where he was attending a tax school.

Mr. Bennett, who had practiced law in Mapleton for more than 55 years and also was a prominent area farmer, became a brigadier general of the Iowa National Guard in 1952 and was a colonel of the Judge Advocate General Corps.

He was insurance commissioner of Iowa from 1955-58 and had served two terms as state senator.


