Ada Lucille, granddaughter of the founder of Shell Rock, and only daughter of Goerke and Elia Mason Adair was born in Shell Rock February 6, 1882, and died at her home here Sunday, June 16, 1963.

Hre oration on graduation from the Shell Rock High School, with the Twentieth Century Class, June 7, 1901 was entitled "Stepping Stones." With emphasis on English, following graduation, she taught in the schools of the Butler County.

. She was united in marrlage to Frank Garner, January 1, 1904 in Shell Rock by Rev. O. H. L. Mason, pastor of the Congrational Church.
