Walter Osborn Passes Away

Walter Osborn, 70, prominent Leon business man, passed away last Saturday evening at the Osborn home in east Leon after an illness of several weeks. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon with burial following in the Leon cemetery. Mr. Osborn came to Leon in 1914 from Davis City after being elected county auditor in which position he served for two terms. He then became the first county agent and served with high efficiency in that position for many years. He served two terms as our representative in the state legislature and on his return to Leon he accepted an appointment as city clerk, serving at the city hall until his retirement last January on account of his health. He served as a member of the school board, was chairman of the American Red Cross, trustee and steward of the Methodist church, was leader of a Boy Scout patrol, member of the draft board in world war one, and an instructor in the GI agricultural school after world war two. He was widely known, a highly respected and influential citizen. He was a member of the Masonic, I.O.O.F., Knights of Pythias lodges, the Rotary club, and the Real Estate Board.
