Caravans Will Boost Play Days

Plans for an automobile caravan into outlying communities next Tuesday and Wednesday for the purpose of extending an invitation to Oskaloosa's Playday festival on Sept. 12, 13 and 14 were announced today following meeting of the caravan committee Friday night.

Howard Frank, chairman of the committee, urged that all Oskaloosans who possibly can meet on the east side of the city square each of the two mornings. The caravan is open to anyone.

On Tuesday the caravan will leave at 9:30 a. m., moving east to Sigourney, then to Hedrick and back to highway 63. From there the group will go into Forestmont and Cedar and then back down to Ottumwa, on to Allamore and return home on highway 9.

The Wednesday caravan, which leaves at the same time and from the same place, will go to Pelletier, Newton, Grinnell, Montezuma, New Sharon, and back home on highway 63.

Frank said that Ivan Kenner, high school band director, has promised to provide a pep band for the caravans and loud speaker equipment will be along to call the playday message at each town.

Tax Credits For Mahaska \$200,000

Mahaska county homestead owners are slated to receive tax credit totaling approximately \$204,000 on their 1949 bill Auditor Roy E. Hinkle said today.

This is almost \$17,000 more than was credited on 1948 taxes under the homestead law which bases exemption on 25 mills of the total homestead valuation as approved by supervisors and certified to the State Tax commission. Supervisors only recently completed their check of applications.

Hinkle said that 4,904 applications for homestead exemption have been approved this year on property carrying a valuation of \$6,157,717 for exemption purposes.

On 25 Mill Basis

Tax credit is figured on a 25 mill basis on all approved homesteads up to a maximum of \$2,500. No credit is allowed on valuation in excess of that figure. Counties are reimbursed for the amount of exemption from state funds.

Following the trend since the homestead law became effective, both the number of applications and valuation has set a new record this year. Applications are 128 more than the 4,776 approved a year ago while the exemption valuation exceeds that of 1948 by more than \$600,000. A year ago the exemption was based on total valuation of \$7,549,171.00.

Ike Reed Dead



Ike M. Reed of Osceola, 79, former Mahaska county auctioneer, hog raiser, sheriff, state representative, and past supreme monarch of the Ancient Mystic Order of Samaritans—the Shrine of the Odd Fellows, died suddenly at his home at Osceola at 3 o'clock this morning after several months' illness with a heart ailment. Ike had resided in Osceola for 14 years and was a resident of Mahaska county 35 years. He was a charter member of Iowa lodge of Odd Fellows at Rose Hill and was a member of the order 53 years. He was actively identified with the Southern Iowa Fair during his residence here and was prominently associated with many community activities. Surviving are his wife, one son, Nile, of Illinois. Funeral services at the Powers funeral home at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon with the Osceola lodge of Odd Fellows assisting with the services. Burial in Forest cemetery. He was born at Barnesville, Belmont county, Ohio, Feb. 22, 1870, and came to Iowa, settling at Rose Hill June 27, 1894. He moved to Oskaloosa when he was elected sheriff in 1911. Later he purchased a farm northeast of Oskaloosa on the Glendale road.

Democrats In Action

Washington, Aug. 25.—(UP)—Midwestern democratic party leaders today gave a new okeh to the controversial Brannan farm program which has been cold-shouldered by this session of congress.

Fresh Endorsement

Party leaders from 16 midwestern states gave the plan a fresh endorsement as a double-edged answer to farm supplies and the party's chances for victory in the 1950 congressional elections.

They acted after Secretary of Agriculture Charles F. Brannan, author of the plan, assured the conference that "a great deal of progress" has been made in winning public support for the program which "promises cheaper food and farmer prosperity."

The conference is composed of the midwest democratic committeemen and state party chairmen who originally endorsed the plan at a party rally at Des Moines, Ia., last June.

Majority Of Farmers For Plan

Although congress has cold-shouldered the plan, Brannan said newspaper polls show that a majority of the farmers who understand the plan favor it. He agreed with the party leaders that a "real selling job" must be done to explain the plan to those who now "don't know enough about it to express an opinion."

The Brannan plan would let market prices fall to "give consumers a break," and the government would send out "production payment" checks to farmers to hold farm income up. Brannan said no one has come up yet with any other "real suggestion" for providing a reasonable return to farmers and reasonable consumer prices.

Jake More Secretary

Jake More of Iowa, secretary of the midwest conference, said that as soon as congress adjourns he would like to see Brannan and Agriculture Secretary Albert J. Loveland go into the Farm Belt and "spread

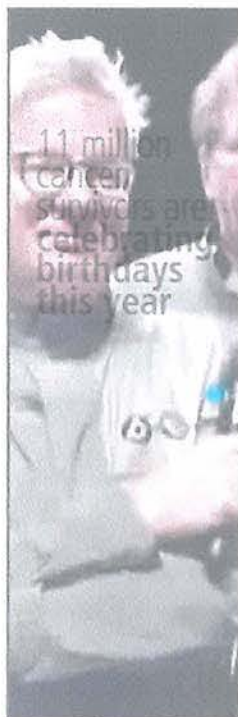
